N Thuriday last the King, the Queen, and the Three Princesses, visited the City of Gloucester. Their Majesties and their Royal Highneffes alighted at the Bifhop's Palace, who, attended by the Dean and Chapter of that Cathedral, and the Clergy of the Diocefe, ad-dreffed the King on the Occasion, who was pleafed to receive them very gracionily, and they had alfo the Honour of being prefented to the Queen. The Mayor The Majeflies then returned to the Gueen. The Mayor and Corporation of Gloucefter then attended, and the Town-Clerk addreffed His Majefty in their Name. They were likewite prefented to the Queen. Their Majeflies afterwards visited the Cathedral, the Pin Manufactory of Mr. Alderman Weaver, the County Infirmary, and the Goal now building agreeably to a Plan of Sir George Paul and Mr. Howard. Their Majeflies then returned to the Bithon's Palace. Their Majeflies then returned to the Bishop's Palace, and as foon as their Equipages were ready, fet out with the Princeffes on their Return to this Place. The Concourse of People in the Streets of Gloucester was immenie; but from the Order that was observed through the Attention of the Magistrates, Their Majesties were not in the least incommoded.

WHEREAS divers Perfons, to whom Money has been iffued for Public Services, have neglected to deliver into this Office the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, in the Manner, and within the Time prefcribed by the Act for better examining and Auditing the Public Accounts of this Kingdom, the Commissioners for Auditing the Public Accounts have directed that Copies of the fol-lowing Sections of the faid Act be inferted in the London Gazette, in order that all Perfons to whom Public Money has been, or shall be, so issued, may be informed of the Consequences of juch Neglett.

SECTION XVII. And whereas great Losses and Inconveniences have arifen to the Public, by Sub-Accountants not having been put in Charge till a long Time has elapfed after the Monies were issued to them, be it enacted, That the Paymaster-General

of His Majelty's Forces, the Treaturer of the Navy, the Treaturer of the Ordnance, and every other Public Officer who fhall hereafter pay into the Hands of any Perfon or Perfons whomfoever, Money for Public Services, by Way of Impreft or on Account, fhall, within Thirty Days of the 31ft Day of December, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-five and within Thirty Days of the and eighty-five, and within Thirty Days of the 31ft Day of December in every future Year, tranfmit an Account of all Sums of Money issued or paid by him or them to any Person or Persons, for the Public Service, within the preceding Year, to the Commissioners to be appointed under the Authority of this Act; who shall, and they are hereby required forthwith to transmit Duplicates of the fame to His Majesty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall immediately, on Receipt of Inch Accounts, put the feveral Sums fo iffued in Charge against the Parties, in like Man-ner as now practifed with respect to Perfons who receive Money by Way of Imprest, and on Ac-count, at the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer.

SECTION XVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Accountant shall be allowed in his Account any Sum which he shall iffue or pay over to any Sub-Accountants, unless he shall have transmitted to the said Commissioners regular Accounts thereof, in the Manner and within the Times abovementioned; unlefs Proof fhall be produced, to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of the Treasury, that any Failure of transmitting the fame did not happen from the wilful Neglect of the Perfon iffuing or paying over the Money as aforefaid. SECTION XX. And be it further enacted and

declared, That every Sub Accountant to whom Money shall hereafter be issued for Public Services, in cafe the Money fo iffued shall have been for. Services to be performed in Great Britain, shall deliver into the Office of the Commissioners to be appointed by virtue of this Act, the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, within Three Months of the End of each Year from the Commencement of his Account, unlefs it has been usual for such Account to be made up to any fixed Period in the Year; in which Cafe they shall be delivered within Three Months of the ufual annual Time of the Determination of each Account respectively; and in case such Monies shall have been issued for Services to be performed in any Part of Europe out of this Kingdom, then the Vouchers shall be delivered within Four Months of the Expiration of each Year's Ac-counts; if in the West Indies, the Continent of America, or in Africa, within Six Months after
