#### Drontheim, July 19.

HE Prince Royal of Denmark arrived here, with a fmall Retinue, on Thursday Evening the 10th inftant, and the next Morning proceeded to review the Camp of 5000 Men near this Place. On his Royal Highnefs's Return here, he employed Two Days in in-fpecting the Fortifications and other public Works, and on Wednefday Morning the Prince fet out on his Return to Denmark.
