**T**HE Prince Royal of Denmark arrived here, with a small Retinue, on Thursday Evening the 10th instant, and the next Morning proceeded to review the Camp of 5000 Men near this Place. On his Royal Highness's Return here, he employed Two Days in inspecting the Fortifications and other public Works, and on Wednesday Morning the Prince set out on his Return to Denmark.
