THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea-Officers between the 1st of January and 30th of June last, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf: These are to give Notice, That the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of the Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, viz. on Monday the 29th and Tuesday the 30th instant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies; on Wednesday the 1st and Thursday the 2d of October, to Lieutenants and their Attornies; and on Friday the 3d to Masters and Surgeons; after which the Lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay; but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in case any of the Sea-Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave, before the Half-Pay can be paid.

APPRENTICE DUTY INDEMNITY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, June 19, 1788.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for Managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the present Session of Parliament, it is enacted; for the Relief of all Persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any Part thereof; upon Monies given, paid; or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert and write in Words, at Length in Indentures or other Writings relating to the Service of any Clerk, Apprentice or Servant; the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in Relation, to every such Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, that upon Payment of double the Rates and Duties upon the Monies; or such Part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, before the 25th Day of December next; to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such Indenture, or other Writing; shall be good and valid; and the Person so offending be excused from any Penalty incurred by the Omission thereof; except those against whom any Prosecution shall be now depending.
