St. James's, September 24.

THE King was this Day pleased to confer the Honour of Knighthood on William Wynne, Doctor of Laws, Official Principal of the Arches, and Master-Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury.

Whitehall, September 27.

The King has been pleased to present the Right Reverend Father in God, John Bishop of Peterborough, to the Deanry of the Cathedral Church of Durham; void by the Death of the Honourable and Reverend Doctor William Digby.

The King has been pleased to approve of Joseph Gazzo, Esq; to be Consul for the Emperor of Germany at Gibraltar.

Dublin Castle, September 23, 1788.

Yesterday being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, in the Morning the Flag was hoisted on Bedford Tower, at Noon the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired Three Rounds,

and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy.

Lisbon, September 13:

On Thursday last, the 11th Instant, about Half an Hour after Four o'Clock in the Afternoon, his Royal Highness the Prince of Brasil died of the Small-Pox.

Hague, September 19.

The Prince and Princess of Orange went Yesterday to the great Church in this Place, where a Sermon was preached before them on the Occasion of the Anniversary of the Revolution which took Place last Year. A grand Concert was afterwards performed in Celebration of that Event; and this Evening there was a Drawing-Room at the House in the Wood; where their Royal and Serene Highnesses received the Compliments of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction residing here.

Whitehall, September 3, 1788.
