Letters from the Bannat of Temeswar, mention that on the 3^d Instant the Emperor marched with his Army from Caransebes to Slatina, which is on the direct Road to Meadia, and only Six German Miles distant from it; that on the 2^d the advanced Guard of General Wartensleben's Corps had retaken Possession of the Village of Cornia; and that the Turks had made themselves Masters of the Vulcaner and Ojotos Passes, in order to facilitate their Entrance into Transylvania.

The last Intelligence, which is dated the 12th, from the Camp at Illova, advises, that no material Change had taken Place in the relative Position of the two Armies.
