**I**N pursuance of the Directions of an Act passed in the Twenty-fourth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled, "An Act to repeal so much of Two Acts made in the Tenth and Fifteenth Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, as authorizes the Speaker of the House of Commons to issue his Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown for making out Writs for the Election of Members to serve in Parliament, in the Manner therein mentioned, and for substituting other Provisions for the like Purposes," I do hereby give Notice, That it hath been certified to me in Writing, under the Hands of Two Members of Parliament, that the Right Honourable Sir James Harris, Knight of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, late Member of Parliament for the Borough of Christchurch, in the County of Southampton, is become a Peer of Great Britain, and summoned to Parliament; and that I shall issue my Warrant to the Clerk of the Crown to make out a new Writ for the electing of a Burgess to serve in this present

Parliament for the said Borough of Christchurch, in the room of the said Right Honourable Sir James Harris, now a Peer of Great Britain, and summoned to Parliament as aforesaid, at the End of Fourteen Days after the Insertion of this Notice in the Gazette: Dated the 29<sup>th</sup> Day of September, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight.

Letters from the Bannat of Temeswar, mention that on the 3<sup>d</sup> Instant the Emperor marched with his Army from Caransebes to Slatina, which is on the direct Road to Meadia, and only Six German Miles distant from it; that on the 2<sup>d</sup> the advanced Guard of General Wartensleben's Corps had retaken Possession of the Village of Cornia; and that the Turks had made themselves Masters of the Vulcaner and Ojotos Passes, in order to facilitate their Entrance into Transylvania.

The last Intelligence, which is dated the 12<sup>th</sup>, from the Camp at Illova, advises, that no material Change had taken Place in the relative Position of the two Armies.

**T**HE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury having appointed Money for the Payment of Half-Pay to Sea-Officers between the 1<sup>st</sup> of January and 30<sup>th</sup> of June last, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that Behalf: These are to give Notice, That the several Payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of the Navy, at Ten o'Clock in the Morning, on the following Days, viz. on Monday the 29<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday the 30<sup>th</sup> instant, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies; on Wednesday the 1<sup>st</sup> and Thursday the 2<sup>d</sup> of October, to Lieutenants and their Attornies; and on Friday the 3<sup>d</sup> to Masters and Surgeons; after which the Lists will be recalled the first and third Wednesdays in every Month, that all Persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the Affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the Benefit of any Public Employment, either at Sea or on Shore, during the Time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce Certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in case any of the Sea-Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that Purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like Certificates and Affidavits from the Persons they are employed by.

Where Officers are Abroad on Leave, their Agents are to produce attested Copies of such Leave, before the Half-Pay can be paid.
