The Queen's Palace, October 17.

Vienna, October 4.

The last Accounts received here from the Imperial Army mention, that in their March from Illova, in the Evening of the 21st of September, Two Columns crossing each other in the Dark, and a false Alarm of the Approach of the Enemy, gave rise to great Confusion, in which some Corps of Austrian Infantry fired at each other, and the Bât Men and Servants were struck with such a Panic, that, throwing off the Loads from their Horses, and out of the Carriages, they fled precipitately, so that many Officers lost their Baggage, and some Regiments a Part of their Field Equipage. The Turks harrassed the Rear Guard, but were vigorously repulsed in the Attacks they made upon it, and obliged to abandon Three of their Standards. A smart Skirmish however took Place near Caranefes, in which the Austrians had 150 Men killed and wounded; and some Houses in that Town were burnt by the Turks. The Emperor continued his March on the 23d to Sezakul, and on the 24th to Lugosch, where he remained on the 28th, the heavy Baggage being sent on to Temeswaer, without meeting any further Interruption from the Enemy.

On the Day preceding the Arrival of the Army at Caranefes, a considerable Number of lawless Wallachians inhabiting the Neighbourhood of Lugosch ran into the Town, spreading a false Alarm that the

Enemy were close at their Heels. This had the Effect they wished for. The Army Baggage (then at Lugosch) was immediately sent off to Temeswaer, when the Wallachians proceeded to pillage whatever they found unguarded, and even many of the Houses. A military Force however soon put an End to these Enormities, and several of the Plunderers were taken, and immediately broken on the Wheel.

From Croatia we learn, that Marshal Laudohn, having repulsed the Basha of Travenick, in his Attack on the Austrians before Novi, and afterwards made a practicable Breach in the Walls of that Fortress, attempted, on the 21st of September, to take it by Assault, but met with so very brave a Resistance, that he was compelled to abandon his Enterprize, and to confine his Operations to a regular Siege. The Loss of the Austrians in this Assault amounted to 71 Men killed, and 213 wounded.

The Garrison of Chotzim, consisting of about 3000 Men, marched out on the 29th of September, with the Honours of War, pursuant to the Capitulation.

Two Light Houses, with Lamps and Reflectors, are now erected:

One of them on Kinnaird Castle, at Kinnaird's Head, near Fraserburgh, on the East Coast of Scotland, Lat. 57. 42. and Long. 1. 20. West of London, Cairnbulg, from the Light House, bearing S. E. and Troup Point W. N. W.

The Lantern is 120 Feet above the Sea at High Water; will be seen from S. E. and W. N. W. and intermediate Points of the Compass, on the North of these Two Points, and has been lighted since the 1st of December last.

The other on the Mull of Cantyre, immediately above the Rocks, known to Seamen by the Name of the Merchants, Lat. 22. 55. and Long. West of London

5. 42.; the Sound of Isla from the Light House bearing, by the Compass, N. by E. and distant 27 Miles; the South End of Isla N. N. W. distant 25 Miles; the North End of Rathlin Island N. W. by W. One-half W.; the Maiden Rocks S. by W. One-half W. distant 14 Miles; and Copland Light S. by W. One-half W. distant 31 Miles.

The Lantern is 235 Feet above the Sea at High Water; and will be seen from N. N. E. 1-4th E.; from S. by W. 1-4th W. and intermediate Points of the Compass; North of these Two Points.

The Lantern will be lighted every Night after the 1st Day of November next.
