*St. James's, October 28.*

**S**ATURDAY last being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, when His Majesty entered into the Twenty-ninth Year of His Reign, the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

*Constantinople, September 15.*

The Plague has again made some Progress here, but has entirely ceased at Smirna for the last Three Weeks.

*St. Petersburg, September 30.*

His Imperial Highness the Great Duke returned to this Capital Yesterday in perfect Health.

*Warsaw, October 8.*

The Diet assembled on Monday last, and chose Count Malachowky for their Marshal. They met again Yesterday, when the King, after having sent for the Equestrian Order to the Senate, proposed a Confederation, which was acceded to without Opposition.

*Copenhagen, October 14.*

Accounts have been received here that the Troops under the Command of the Prince of Hesse had advanced to the Environs of Gothenburgh on the 5th instant; that the King of Sweden had arrived in that City on the 3d; and that an Armistice, for Eight Days, had been agreed upon between them on the 10th.

Two Light Houses, with Lamps and Reflectors, are now erected:

One of them on Kinnaird Castle, at Kinnaird's Head, near Fraserburgh, on the East Coast of Scotland, Lat. 57. 42. and Long. 1. 20. West of London, Cairnbulg, from the Light House, bearing S. E. and Troup Point W. N. W.

The Lantern is 120 Feet above the Sea at High Water; will be seen from S. E. and W. N. W. and intermediate Points of the Compass; on the North of these Two Points, and has been lighted since the 1st of December last.

The other on the Mull of Cantyre, immediately above the Rocks, known to Seamen by the Name of the Merchants, Lat. 55. 22. and Long. West of London 5. 42.; the Sound of Isla from the Light House bearing, by the Compass, N. by E. and distant 27 Miles; the South End of Isla N. N. W. distant 25 Miles; the North End of Ratblin Island N. W. by W. One-half W.; the Maiden Rocks S. by W. One-half W. distant 14 Miles; and Copland Light S. by W. One-half W. distant 31 Miles.

The Lantern is 235 Feet above the Sea at High Water; and will be seen from N. N. E. 1-4th E.; from S. by W. 1-4th W. and intermediate Points of the Compass, North of these Two Points.

The Lantern will be lighted every Night after the 1st Day of November next.
