Saturday last being the Anniversary of His Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Bedford Tower, at Noon the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phænix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by Order of his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

St. Peterfburgh, October 3. This being the Anniversary of the Empress's Cotonation, there was a numerous Drawing-Room this Morning, and in the Evening a splendid Ball at Court. Her Imperial Majesty on this Occasion conferred the Order of the first Class of St. Wolodimir on the Generals in Chief Count Moussin-Pouschkin; and Monsieur Yerapkosi, Governor of Moscow; and Crosses of the lower Classes of that Order were given to several other Persons, both in the Civil and Military Line. Prince Yousoupow, the Russian Minister at Turin, was at the same Time raised to the Rank of Senator.

Wednesday last being the Anniversary of the Great Duke's Birth-Day, it was celebrated as usual in Grand Gala at Court, and in the Evening there was a Ball.

Vienna, October 15.

The News of the taking of Novi on the 3d Instant, by Assault, was received here on the 10th, and that the Turkish Garrison, consisting of 600 Men, had surrendered themselves Prisoners of War. Forty Pieces of Cannon, with large Quantities of every Sort of Ammunition, were found in the Place.

By Letters of the 9th it appears that the Emperor was still in the Neighbourhood of Lugos; that his

advanced Post occupied the rising Grounds on one Side of Caransebes; and that the Turks remained Masters of the Heights on the other Side of that

Vienna, October 18.

The Letters from the Bannat have arrived here of late very irregularly; but we have certain Intelli-gence of the Retreat of the Turkish Army towards Belgrade, and of the March of the Imperialists, on or about the 12th Instant, to harrass their Rear, and observe their Motions. His Imperial Majesty was at Temeswar on the 12th, to examine the State of that Fortress.

Copenhagen, October 18.

By Letters received this Day from Gothenburgi dated the 16th Instant, it appears that a further Armistice for Four Weeks had been that Day agreed upon between the King of Sweden and the Prince of Hesse.

Copenhagen, October 21.

A new and more conspicuous Light House has just been erected by Order of this Government on the Island of Anholt. It is of a cylindrical Form, 50 Danish Ells in Height, and 30 Ells in Circum-ference; and on the Summit is placed a Furnace, or Grate, Two Feet Nine Inches high, and Five Feet in Diameter; so that the Flame, being stronger and more than double the former Altitude, (which was only 22 Ells) will be observed at a much greater Distance. The Edifice is 2,500 Danish Ells to the Westward of the old Building: It is 3,100 Ells from the East Point of the Island, and 56 Ells above the Surface of the Water. The Fire will be kindled in the new Light-House on the 14th of Nove be at Half an Hour after Sun-set; and from the Time the old Light will be discontinued. The Danish Ell is Two English Feet nearly.
