## From Saturday November 1, to Cuelbay November 4, 1788.

Whiteball; November 4: HE King has been pleafed to prefent the Reverend John Garlies Maitland to the Church and Parilli of Monnigoff, in the Prelbytery of Wigtoun, and Stewartry of Kirkcubright, vacant by the Death of the Reverend Ebenezer Stott.

Warfaw, October 15. By the last Accounts received here from Oczakow; it appears that the Ruffians continued their Operasions against that Place, and that the Turks made Frequent Sallies, but that nothing of Importance had lately happened there:

### Vienna, October 22.

The Emperor, after visiting the Fortreffes of Temeswar and Arad, (at the first of which Places Marshal Pelegrini remains as Governor) returned to the Army on the 15th Instant, which on the 16th had reached a Village called Soka, and was expected to arfive at Apova, on the Banks of the Danube, this Day or To-morrow. The Division under General Wartensleben, confisting of about 15,000 Men, has retaken Possession of Caranlebes, and extended its Patrols as far as Cornia: General Dalton advances with his Corps to Werfchetz and Weifkirchen. The Turks remain Matters of Meadia, Schupaneck and Orfova; but they have abandoned Panfoya; and their principal Force occupies the two Banks of the Danube in the Neighbourhood of Belgrade.
