His Majesty's Advancement towards Recovery still continues.

Stockholm, February 3.

In the Course of last Week his Swedish Majesty nominated M. Ludberg, Burgomaster of this Town, Speaker of the Burghers, and M. Olof Olofson, a Farmer of the Province of Ostrogothia, Speaker of the Peasants. After which the Four Houses assembled, and sent the usual Deputations to compliment the King and Royal Family; and the Business of inscribing the Names, and examining the Full Powers of the Members of the respective Houses, being nearly completed, all the States were convened to assist at the opening of the Diet, the Summons for which Purpose was published last Saturday, with the like Ceremonies as were observed in the Proclamation. The States accordingly repaired Yesterday Morning to the Cathedral, and from thence to the Hall of the States in the Palace, where the King being seated on the Throne, in his Royal Robes, made a long Speech upon the various interesting Objects to be brought before the Diet. After his Majesty had ended, the Secretary of State, Monf. de Schroederheim, who officiated as Chancellor of the Court, read a Paper, stating, in general Terms, the Care his Majesty had bestowed upon the different Branches of the interior Administration. The Marshal of the Diet, and the Speakers of the Three inferior Orders, then complimented his Majesty, in the Names of their respective Houses, and were admitted to the Honour of kissing his Hand.

The Four Houses being again assembled To-day, the King laid before them the Propositions on which they are to deliberate, one of which was for the Election of a Committee, to which he might more

particularly communicate the present State of Affairs. The Four Orders returned immediately to their respective Houses, and the Nobles resolved to have their Protocols printed and published, in the same Manner as in the last Diet: The reading of the Form of Government, of the Regulations of the House of Nobles, and the Elections, which are Matters of Course, will take up some Days, before the Equestrian Order can proceed to the Election of the Committee.
