HIS Day the Lords being met, a Meffage was fent to the Honourable Houfe of Commons by Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Ufher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that The Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, do desire the immediate At-tendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commiffion read; and the Com-mons being come thither, the Lord Chancellor made the following Speech to both Houfes.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

HIS Majefty not thinking fit to be prefent here this Day in His Royal Perfon, has been pleated to caule a Commission to be issued under His Great Scal, authorizing and commanding the Commissioners who are appointed by former Letters Patent to hold this Parliament, to open and declare certain further Caufes for holding the fame : Which Commiffion you will now hear read.

And the fame being read accordingly, the Lord Chancellor then faid,

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

IN Obedience to His Majetty's Commands, and by Virtue of both Commissions already mentioned to you, (one of which has now been read) we proceed to lay before you fuch further Matters as His Majefty has judged proper to be now communicated to His Parliament.

His Majefty being, by the Bleffing of Providence, happily recovered from the fevere Indifpolition with which He has been afflicted; and being enabled to attend to the Public Affairs of His Kingdoms, has commanded us to convey to you His warmest Acknowledgements for the additional Proofs which you have given of your affectionate Attachment to His Perfon, and of your zealous Concern for the Honour and Interests of His Crown, and the Security and good Government of His Dominions.

The Interruption which has neceffarily been oc-cafioned to the Public Bufinefs will, His Majefty doubts not, afford you an additional Incitement to apply yourfelves, with as little Delay as poffible, to

the different Objects of National Concern which require your Attention-

His Majesty has likewife ordered us to acquaint you that, fince the Clofe of the laft Seffion, He has you that, ince the Close of the latt Semon, Fie has concluded a Treaty of Defensive Alliance with His Good Brother the King of Prufila, Copies of which will be laid before you: That His Majefty's Endea-vours were employed, during the laft Summer, in Conjunction with His Allies, in order to prevent, as much as possible, the Extension of Hostilities in the North, and to manifest His Defire of effecting a General Pacification : That no Opportunity will be Defected, on His Part, to promote this falutary Object; and that He has, in the mean Time, the Satisfaction of receiving, from all Foreign Courts, continued Affurances of their friendly Dispositions to this Country.

Gentlemen of the Houfe of Commons, We are commanded by His Majefty to acquaint you, that the Estimates for the current Year will forthwith be laid before you ; and that He is perfuaded of your Readiness to make the necessary Provisions for the feveral Branches of the Public Service.

My Lords, and Gentlemen,

We have it particularly in Charge from His Majefty to assure you, that you cannot so effectually meet the most earnest Wish of His Majesty's Heart, as by perfevering in your uniform Exertions for the Public Welfare, and by improving every Occafion to pro-mote the Profperity of His Faithful People, from whom His Majefly has received fuch repeated and affecting Marks of invariable Zeal, Loyalty and Attachment, and whole Happinels He must ever confider as infeparable from His own.
