Beverning, their Extraordindry Ambafidox, that their Intertions to a General Peace, correfpond with tho defore bis Majefty bath alwayes bad to procure the fame, and that they are ready to accept the Gonditions which bis Majeffy buld offered them by bes Ambigfudors and Flenipotentiaries at Nimeguen. But at the jame time that the Heet Van Beverning hath thus made known to bim the Sentiments of the Jaid States General, be barb in their $\wedge$ ame prayed his Majeft would gravt a Cefacion of Arms for $\rho \times$ Weeks, and bath reprefented to bim, that they bad need of that time, to communicate with their Allies, ard to obtain the tr confent for the consc.uding of so Great a work. The condition in whbich bis majefties arms are at prefent, and the favourible opportunity that woculd $\mathrm{E}_{4}$ lost in deferring their a fing, would soos permit bims To confent to this 1 ropofal, if the defos to give reace to Europe, did not much more prevail 2 b bim, than that of entarging bis Frontieys by neri.e.tonquefts. It in, in tkis corfotepation to contributte to the Tublick Repore, that ke potill apres, at the d. fore of the Jaid States Gereral, to a Celfation of Arms for fix woecks, to begin the first day of the frext month, ficity an'one is was jtipulated letween Frafice and Spain in the year 1668. But fora fmath as it nourd not be just, if the Enemies of buw Majefly glould let that time pals fruitlefly, and that inflead of its ferving to advance the Peaces they frould mise endvantage theredf, to avoid tbe effett of bis Majefiies Arms, that be 9 Fould bave lost the ddvantageous corjuncure rebich is at treferit in bis kand; Hit Majefty defores of the faid States Gemeril, that they do promife $b$ im, tbat in cafs $d x-$ ring the time of the faid Ceffation of Arms, they caxrot bring the ir Aluies to accept the Conditions mbtcb be bait offered, They will not affist them diresly or indirectily -dgainflibim, or againf? bis Alllies, during the inbole cour $\sqrt{e}$ of the War. In exchernge bis Majefty zoill in fuch ca, e renew to thenn the Jame Exgagements, whicb be bath taken portb them by bir Lester of tbe 18 of the last month, as woll for what concerns the fame Cosiditions, anbich be y.ill be alwoyes ready to agree to Spain as for the fecur ity of the places in the Netherlands. His Majefty batb thought fit to make known to the Said States General, by this Memorial, which be bath appointed to be delivered to the -Heer Van Beverning, the fincerity of kic Intentions for a Feace. And to give them a yet far greater teftimony thereof, be dorb command tho Dulike of Luxembnrg, General of bis Army, to go and expedt their $14 y f w e r$, dxring this month, in the Neighbarhood of Brulfels, with Orders sot to attack any place during that time. Brufels, fune 7 The French Army, under the command of the Duke of Luxemburgh, is encamped at Leurve St. Pierre, a League from this City, in the way to Noftre Dame de Hall, their advanced Guards are at Anderlach, not half a League from hence, and their Parties come almoft to our Gates every day, Marefchal d'Humieres has put malt of his Troops into quarters of refrefhment; and Monfieur Montal having drawn out the greateft part of the Garifons between the Sambre and the Meufe, has polted himfelf with a confiderable Body on this fide Mons, hath fortified all the Paffes, and fo clofely fhut $p \mathrm{p}$ the place on all fides, that no body can go in or out. In the mean time the Spanifh Troops are encamped upon the Canal, between this place and Vibvord, and we are told that the Dutch Troops will advance this way
very fuddenly. The Letters we recelve from Liegé, give us an account, that a Party of the Garifon of Maeftricht, made the laft week an incurfion into the Dutchy of fuliers, and burnt above 30 Villages, and fir Cattles, belonging to Gentlemen. The French have fent a Detachment towards Germany.

Antwerp, Fune 7. Monficur Beverning, who was fent by the Slates General to the Molt Chriftian King, returned foùr day es fince on his way to the hague, having obtained a Ceffation of Arms, which we here look upon as a great ltep towards the Peace. The Frencls Army is now encamped in the Neighborhood of Bruflels, and the Generals have Orders not to at ${ }^{-}$ tack any place, but to continue to raife Constibutions as formerly, and to provide fubfirtence for th. Army at the colt of thefe Countries. Mons is ficwiclafer blocked up than ever, by the Sieur de Montal.

Paris, June 8. Since the Kings retarn to St. Germains, the whole difcourle at Court has been of ${ }_{1}$ poace. His Majefly has left bis Army in Fleanders ute
 according to our laft Adivice, was encamped bitween Alost and Zivioue. The Mar with four Pattalions of Foot and ten Squadrons of Horfe, to join the marefchal de schomberg, who is at prefent about dix la Cbapelle, his defign, it's thought, is to fall into the Dutchy of $\mathcal{F}$ uliers. From Alface we have Letters of the 4 th inftant, which fay, that the Marefchal de Crequi is encamped at Alayen near Friburg and that the Imperial Army is removed to Ferkirg and Knigtzuck- that the Duke of Lorrain had given Orders for the finifhing with all the fpeed puffible the Bridge over the Rhine at Rheinam. The 3 dinitant, a Party of Imperialifts came to near the Marefchal de Crequi's Army, as to fall upon the Guatds, anci to beat them to a certain Church, where a Body of Fcot was polled, they took four Troopers andequarterma er Prifonels The Letters we receiv fiom Rome fay, the Iurks had taken Rggufa; which, if it b trae, will give a great Alarm to the Vemetians, \&c.
