Beverning, their Extraordinary Ambassador, that their Intentions to a General Peace, correspond with the desire bis Majesty bath alwayes had to procure the same, and that they are ready to accept the Conditions which his Majesty hash offered them by his Ambassudors and Plenipotentiaries at Nimeguen. But at the Jame time that the Heer Van Beverning hath thus made known to him the Sentiments of the Jaid States General, he bath in their Name prayed his Majest, would grant a Cessation of Arms for fix Weeks, and bath represented to him, that they had need of that time, to communicate with their Allies, and to obtain their consent for the conc.uding of so great a work. The condition in which his Majesties Arms are at present, and the favourable opportunity that would be lost in deferring their afting, would not permit him to consent to this I roposal, if the destine to give Peace to Europe, did not much more prevail in him, than that of entarging his Frontiers by new Conquests. It is in this corsideration to contribute to the Tublick Repose, that be will agree, at the desire of the said States General, to a Cessation of Arms for six weeks, to be gin the first day of the next month, such an one or was stipulated Letween France and Spain in the year 1668. But for asmuch as it Would not be just, if the Enemies of Low Majesty frould let that time pals fruitlessly, and that instead of its ferving to advance the Peace, they should make advantage thereof, to avoid the effect of his Majesties Arms, that be Prouls bave lost the advantageous conjuncture which is at present in his kand; His Majesty desires of the said States General, that they do promise him, that in case during the time of the said Cessation of Arms, they cannot bring their Alies to accept the Conditions which be hath offered, They will not aff. I them directly or indirectly against bim, or against bu Allies, during the whole course of the War. In exchange bu Majesty will in such case renew to them the same Engagements, which he hath taken with them by his Letter of the 18 of the last month, as well for what concerns the same Conditions, which he will be alwayes ready to agree to Spain as for the security of the places in the Netherlands. His Majesty hath thought sit to make known to the said States General, by this Memorial, which he hath appointed to be delivered to the Heer Van Beverning, the sincerity of his Intentions for a Peace. And to give them a yet far greater testimony thereof, be doth command the Duke of Luxemburg, General of his Army, to go and expest their Answer, during this month, in the Neighborhood of Brussels, with Orders not to attack any place during that time. Brussels, June 7 The French Army, under the command of the Duke of Luxemburgh, is encamped at Leuwe St. Pierre, a League from this City, in the way to Nostre Dame de Hall, their advanced Guards are at Anderlack, not half a League from hence, and their Parties come almost to our Gates every day, Mareschal d'Humieres has put most of his Troops into quarters of refreshment; and Monsieur Montal having drawn out the greatest part of the Garisons between the Sambre and the Meuse, has posted himfelf with a considerable Body on this side Mons, hath fortified all the Passes, and so closely shut up the place on all fides, that no body can go in or out. In very fuddenly. The Letters we receive from Liege, give us an account, that a Party of the Garison of Maestricht, made the last week an incursion into the Dutchy of fuliers, and burnt above 30 Villages, and six Castles, belonging to Gentlemen. The French have fent a Detachment towards Germany.

Antwerp, June 7. Monsicur Beverning, who was fent by the States General to the Most Christian King, returned four dayes fince on his way to the Hague, having obtained a Ceffation of Arms, which we here look upon as a great step towards the Peace. The French Army is now encamped in the Neighborhood of Bruffels, and the Generals have Orders not 10 attack any place, but to continue to raise Contributions as formerly, and to provide substituence for the Army at the cost of these Countries. Mont is now closer blocked up than ever, by the Sienr de Montal.

Paris, June 8. Since the Kingsteturn to St. Germains, the whole discourse at Court has been of Pleace. His Majesty has lest his Army in Flanders under the Command of the Duke of Luxemingh, who, according to our last Advice, was encamped between Alost and Ninoue. The Marquis d' Albret is gone with four Pattalions of Foot and ten Squadrons of Horse, to join the Mareschal de Schomberg, who is at present about Aix la Chapelle, his design, it's thought, is to fall into the Dutchy of Juliers. From Alface we have Letters of the 4th instant, which say, that the Mareschal de Crequi is encamped at Alayen near Friburg and that the Imperial Army is removed to Herking and Knigtzuk- that the Duke of Lorrain had given Orders for the finishing with all the speed possible the Bridge over the Rhine at Rheinaw. The 3d instant, a Party of Imperialists came to near the Mareschal de Crequi's Army, as to fall upon the Guards, and to beat them to'a certain Church, where a Body of Poot was polled, they took four Troopers The Letters we reand a Quarterma er Prifoncis ceiv-from Rome say, the Turks had taken Ragusa; which, if it b true, will give a great Alarm to the Venetians, &c.
