PROCLAMATION

. For suppressing Riots and Tumults committed by Colliers and others in the Counties of Northum berland and Durham, and for opprehending and bringing to Justice the Perfons who have com-mitted or shall commit the fame.

WHEREAS it has been reprefented to Us, W that a great Number of Pitmen, to the Number of Two Hundred and upwards, did in a tumultuous, diforderly and riotous Manner, affemble themfelves, upon the Tenth Day of March laft, at Long Benton Colliery, in the County of Northum-berland, and there wilfully and malicioufly damaged and deftroyed feveral Engines crected for drawing Coals out of feveral of the Pits of the faid Colliery, and did also wilfully and maliciously fet on Fire one Pit belonging to the faid Colliery, and the fame continued on Fire for two whole Days, to the great Damage of the Proprietors thereof; and alfo that on the faid Tenth Day of March a Number of Pitmen, to the Number of Two Hundred and upwards, affembled themfelves in like Manner at a certain Pit called the Robert Pit, belonging to Shire Moore Colliery, in the County aforefaid, and there wilfully and malicioufly deltroyed and damaged various Implements, Materials and Engines belonging to the fame: And alfo, that on the faid tenth Day of March, a number of Pitmen t) the Number of One Hundred and upwards, did in like Manner affemble themfelves at Walls-End Colliery in the County aforefaid, and wilfully and malicioufly did confiderable Damage to the Gins and Machines belonging to the faid Colliery : And alfo that on the faid tenth Day of March, a Number of Pitmen, to the Number of One Hundred and up-wards, in like Manner allembled, wilfullyand maliciously broke and damaged the Engine for drawing Coals at the Engine Pit of Eaft Benton Colliery in the County aforefaid : Whereas it has also been reprefented unto Us, that a Number of Perfons to the Number of One Hundred and upwards, affembled themselves together upon the faid tenth Day of March last, at a Colliery called Walker Colliery, fituate in the faid County, and by Force and Violence prevented the working of a certain Coal Pit belonging to the faid Colliery, and broke and damaged a certain Engine or Engines belonging to the fame, and violently affaulted fome of the Workmen of the faid Colliery, and threw down Heap Lamps into the faid Pit with Fire in them : And whereas it has also been represented to Us, that upon the Eleventh or Twelfth Days of the faid Month of March divers Perfons affembled themfelves together in a like riotous, tumultuous and illegal Manner at Gosforth Pit, belonging to the faid Colliery, and threw Lamps and other Ma-terials down the fame : And whereas it has alfo been represented to Us, that on the feveral Days aforefaid, divers Perfons being riotoufly, tumultuoufly and illegally affembled, did various other Outrages and Mischiefs to several of the Coal Mines in the faid Counties of Northumberland and Durham; in open Defiance of Justice and the Laws, by which the Peace of the faid County, and the Lives and Properties of Our good Subjects are greatly endangered; We, therefore, being deeply fentible of the many mifchievous Confequences that must inevitably enfue to the Peace of Our Kingdom, and the Lives and Properties of Our loving Subjects from fuch wicked and illegal Practices, if they shall go unpunished ; and being firmly refolved to cause the Laws of this Our Kingdom to be put in Execution for the Punishment of all fuch Offenders, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this

Our Royal Pioclamation, hereby firicly commanding and requiring all Our Justices of the Peace. Sheriffs, Under Sheriffs, and all other Our Civil Officers whatfoever, that they do use their utmost Endeavours for discovering and apprehending the Perfons who We are informed are concerned in the faid Outrages and Riots, and who shall be concerned in any fuch riotous and dangerous Practices, to the End they may be brought to Juffice. And We do hereby promife and declare, that if any Perfon or Perfons concerned in the faid Outrages and Felonics, or in any of the faid Crimes, shall, on or before the Third Day of June next, discover and apprehend, or cause to be discovered and apprehended, any other Perfon or Perfons who hath or have or fhall have been concerned in any of the faid Offences, that have or shall have been committed on or fince the faid Tenth Day of March last, fo as he or they may be convicted thereof, fuch Difcoverer or Difcoverers thereof shall have Our most Gracious Pardon. And as a further Encouragement to such as shall discover the faid Offenders, We do hereby further promise and declare, that any Perfon or Perfons who shall, on before the faid Third Day of June next, dif-cover and apprehend, or caufe to be difcovered and apprehended, any of the Perfons concerned in the faid Outrages and Riots, fo as he or they may be convicted thereof, shall have and receive for every Perfon fo difcovered, apprehended and convicted, the Sum of FIFTY POUNDS, which faid Sum the Commissioners of Our Treasury, or Our Lord High Treasurer for the Time being, are hereby directed and required to pay accordingly, without any further Warrant in that Behalf. And We do hereby further strictly charge and command all Our Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Under Sheriffs, and other Officers aforefaid, that they do use the most effectual Means for suppressing all Riots and Tumults, and to that End effectually put in Execution an Act of Parliament made in the First Year of the Reign of Our late Royal Anceflor, King George the Firft, of glorious Me-mory, intituled, "An A& for preventing Tu-mults and riotous Affemblies, and for the more speedy and effectual punishing the Rioters," and all other Laws and Statutes made against Riots, Routs, and unlawful Affemblies; and that the faid Juffices, and all other Our Civil Officers to whom it doth appertain, do give the necessary Di-rections that sufficient Watch and Ward be duly kept at fuch Times and Places as they shall judge necessary for the preventing and suppressing the like Diforders. And We do hereby further ftrictly charge and command all Our Officers, Civil and Military, and all other Our loving Subjects, that they be aiding and affifting in the Execution of Our Commands herein, and in the apprehending and taking the faid Per-fons and all other Perfons who have offended, or thall hereafter offend in Manuer aforefoid. or shall hereafter offend in Manner aforefaid. And We do hereby charge and command, that the faid Offenders be profecuted with the utmost Severity and Rigour of the Law, We being refolved to fupprefs fuch Riots and Tumults by a most strict and exemplary Punishment of all fuch Offenders, And We do hereby command the respective Justices of the Peace and other Magistrates aforefaid, that they do from Time to Time transmit an exact Account of what they shall do pursuant to this Our Royal Proclamation, to one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.
