A PROCLAMATION

For a General Thank/giving for His Majefty's Recovery.

GEORGE R.

WE, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indipensible Duty which We owe to Almighty God, for the manifold and inclimable Bleffings which We have received at His Hands; and defiring to manifest to Our faithful and loving Subjects, and to the World, the deep and devout Senie which We entertain of His late Mercies vouchsafed unto Us, by prostrating Ourselves before His Divine MajeRy, and offering up, in the molt public and folemn Manner, Our Praifes and Thankfgivings for that fignal Interposition of His good Providence, which hath removed from Us the late Illnefs with which We have been afflicted, and which hath established and confirmed in Us the furest Trust and Confidence in His Protection, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to islue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a General Thankigiving to Almighty God, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout England, Wales and the Town of Berwick upon Tweed, on Thursday the Twenty-third Day of this Inflant April; and for the better and more orderly folemnizing the fame, We have given Directions to the Moft Reverend the Archbifhops and Right Reverend the Bishops of England to compose a Form of Prayer suitable to the Occasion, to be used in all Churches and Chapels, and other Places of Public Worship, and to take Care for the timely Dispersing of the same throughout their re-spective Dioceles. And We do strictly charge and command that the faid Public Day of Thankigiving be religiously observed by all Our loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of fuffering fuch Punifhment as We can juily inflict upon all fuch who fhall contemn or negleft the fame.

WE, taking into Our most ferious Confideration the indispensible Duty which We owe to Almighty God, for the manifold and ineftimable Blef-

fings which We have received at His Hands, and defiring to manifest to Our faithful and loving Subjects and to the World, the deep and devout Senfe which We entertain of His late Mercies vouch afed unto Us, by proftrating Ourfelves before His Divine Majefty, and offering up, in the most public and fo-lemn Manner, Our Praifes and Thankfgivings for that fignal Interpolition of His good Providence; which hath removed from Us the late Illnefs with which We have been afflicted, and which hath established and confirmed in Us the furest Trust and Confidence in His Protection, have thought fit, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, to iffue this Our Royal Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding that a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God, for these His Mercies, be observed throughout that Part of Our Kingdom of Great Britain called Scotland, upon Thursday the Twenty-third Day of this Instant April, and We do strictly charge and command that the faid Public Thankfgiving be re-verently and decently observed by all Our loving Subjects in Scotland, on the faid Twenty-third Day of this Inflant April, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and would avoid His Wrath and Indignation, and upon Pain of fuch Punishment as We may jultly inflict on all fuch as contemn or neglect the Performance of fo religious a Duty. Our Will and Pleafure is, therefore and We charge that this Our Proclamation feen, ye forthwith pais to the Market Crofs of Edinburgh, and all other Places needful, and there in Our Name and Authority make Publication thereof, that none pretend Ignorance. And Our Will and Pleafure is, that Our Solicitor do caule printed Copies hereof to be fent to the Sheriffs. of the feveral Shires, Stewards of Stewarties, and Bailiffs of Regalities, and their Clerks, whom We ordain to fee the fame published, and We appoint them to fend Copies thereof to the feveral Parish Churches within their Bounds, that upon the Lord's Day, immediately preceding the Day above mentioned, the fame may be published and read from the Pulpits immediately after Divine Service.
