#### Whitehall, May 12.

HE following Addrefs of the Governor, Af-fittants and Fellowship of Merchants Ad-venturers of England, refiding in Hamburgh, having been transmitted by Emanuel Mathias, Efq; His Majetty's Minister Plenipotentiary to the Circle of Lower Saxony, to his Grace the Duke of Leeds, His Majelty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has been by him prefented to the King: Which Addrefs His Majetty was pleased to receive very gracioufly. .

## To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Mcft Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's molt dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Governor, Affifiants and Fellowship of Merchants Adventurers of England, refiding in Hamburgh, in General Court assembled, beg Leave to offer to your Majefly our fincere Congratulations, that by a fignal Interposition of Divine Providence your Majelty is again reftored to perfect Health, and to the Government of your Kingdoms, the Anxiety of your most Amiable Confort and Illustrious Family is removed, and your loving Subjects are relieved from Alarm and Despondency

Penetrated ourfelves with the most lively Emotions of Jov on this important Event, we have the farther Gratification to observe, that in this Place, amongst People of all Nations, there is but one Sentiment which accords with our own; and we exult in the Thought that for fuch universal Sympathy there must be an adequate Cause.

We ardently with that your Majefty, in the full Enjoyment of every public and domestic Felicity, may long continue to reign in the Hearts of a loyal, united and happy People, and that you may have the Glory and Satisfaction to promote and maintain the Peace of the World.
