The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by an Act passed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act "to enable His Majefty to authorize, in Cafe of "Neceffity, the Importation of Bread, Flour, In-" dian Corn, and Live Stock from any of the Terri-" tories belonging to the United States of America " into the Province of Quebec, and all the Coun-" tries bordering on the Gulf of St. Lawrence, " and the Islands within the faid Gulf, and to the " Coast of Labrador," it is enacted. That it shall and may be lawful for His Majefty in Council, by Order or Orders, to be iffued and published from Time to Time, to authorize, in Cafe of Neceffity, the bringing or importing of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, as well into the Province of Quebec as into all the Countries bordering on the Gulf of St. Lawrence, and into the Islands within the faid Gulf, and also to the Coast of Labrador, for the then enfuing Seafon only, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for the Supply of the Perfons employed in the Fisheries there carried on; provided always, that fuch Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and Live Stock, fo authorized to be imported or brought, shall not be imported or brought, except in Conformity to fuch Rules, Regulations and Restrictions as shall be specified in such Order or Orders, and except by British Subjects and in Bri-tish built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law : And whereas it is expedient and neceflary that Provision be made for fully fupplying the Perfons employed in carrying on the faid Fisheries for the enfuing Scalon with Bread, Flour, and Indian Corn; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That for the

faid Fisheries, for the enfuing Seafon only, Bread, Flour and Indian Corn be allowed to be imported and brought as well into the faid Province of Quebec as into all the Countries bordering on the Gulf of St. Lawrence, and into the Illands within the faid Gulf, and alfo to the Coaft of Labrador, from any of the Territories belonging to the faid United States, by British Subjects, and in British built Ships owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, and which fhall, within the Space of Seven Months previous to the Time of fuch Im-portation, have cleared out from fome Port in Great Britain, or fome other Port of His Majefty's Do-minions in Europe, for which Purpole a Licence thall have been granted by the Committioners of His Majesty's Customs in England or Scotland, or the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland, or any other Person or Petsons who may be duly authorized in that Kingdom respectively, in the Manner and Form hereinafter mentioned ; which Licences shall continue and be in Force for Seven Calendar Months from the Day of the Date upon which they are respectively granted, and no longer; provided that no fuch Licence as aforefaid, granted after the Fourteenth Day of July, One Thoufand Seven Hundred and Eighty nine, fhall be of any Force or Effect: And His Majefty is hereby fur-ther pleafed to order, That the Mafter or Perfon having the Charge or Command of any Ship or Veffel to whom fuch Licence shall be granted, shall, upon the Arrival of the faid Ship or Vessel at the Port, Harbour or Place in the faid Province, Countries, Islands or Coast where he shall discharge such Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, deliver up the faid Licence to the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms there, or in Cafe there shall be no Officer of the Cuftoms, to the Naval Officer at fuch Port, Harbour, or Place, having first indorsed on the Back of fuch Licence the Marks, Numbers and Contents of each Package of Bread, Flour, or Indian Corn, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture in the faid Act mentioned. And the Collector or other proper Officer of the Cuftoms, or Naval Officer, at fuch Port, Harbour, or Place, is hereby enjoined and required to give a Certificate to the Matter or Perfon having the Charge or Command of fuch Ship or Veffel of his having received the faid Licence, fo indorfed as before directed, and to transmit the fame to the Commiffioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms in England or Scotland, or to the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue in Ireland respectively, by Supply of the Perfons employed in carrying on the | whom fuch Licence was granted.
