Westminster, June 9.

THIS Day His Majesty went in State to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes, seated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Knt. Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, presented to His Majesty Henry Adington, Esq; whom they had chosen to be their Speaker: And the Lord Chancellor having, by the King's Command, signified His Majesty's Approbation of their Choice, His Majesty was pleased to retire, and the Commons withdrew.
