Dublin Cafile, June 13. Letters Patent have been paffed under the Great Seal of this Kingdom, for translating the Right Reverend Doctor Eufeby Cleaver, Bishop of Cork and Rofs, to the United Bishopricks of Leighlin and Ferns, vacant by the Death of the Right Reverend Doctor William Preston, late Bishop thereo?.

Letters Patent have also been passed for promoting the Reverend William Forster, A. M. to the United Bishopricks of Cork and Ross.

Stockbolm, June 5.

A Corps of about 1100 Ruffians having affembled at a Village called Ruskiala, on the Borders of the Province of Carelia, waiting only for the Arrival of a fufficient Number of Pieces of Ordnance to make an Irruption into that Province, Major Gripenberg, who was posted in the Neighbourhood, with a Battalion of the Regiment of Tavastehus and Four Cannon, refolved to attack the Enemy, on the 17th Ult. though his whole Force confifted only of about 250 Men. On their Approach the Swedes were fo fortunate as immediately to ditmount fome Field Pieces, with which the Ruffians difputed the Entrance of the Village, and foon after the Powder Magazine of the Enemy blew up, by which a great Number of them perified. The Battle then commenced, and continued with great Obstinacy for upwards of Three Hours. Major Gripenberg computes the Lofs of the Enemy at 400 killed, and a confiderable Number wounded. He quitted the Field, however, though he had only 17 killed and 30 wounded. The Ruffians also after the Action evacuated Rufkiala, and retreated to Sordawalla. The Swedes fired with red hot Shot, being informed that the Ruffians had deposited their Powder in one of the adjoining Houfes. Major Gripenberg has been promoted to the Rank of Lieutenant-Colonel, every Officer under his Command has been advanced one Degree, and a Reward of a Swedish Ducat is ordered to be given to each

private Soldier. The Port of Helfingfors is blocked up by a Russian Squadron.

Squadron. On Tuefday Night laft his Swedifh Majefty fet out for Finland.

Warferso, June 6.

The Accounts received here of the Turkifh Force in the Black Sea make it amount to Sixteen Ships of the Line, and Twenty-one Frigates. In all 121 Sail, including Bomb-Ketches, Gun-Boats, &c.

Vienna, June 10.

On Sunday last the Emperor had a Return of his Fever, but he is this Morning rather better.

Advice has been received from Croatia, that the Turks have been repulsed in a fecond Irruption which they they had attempted to make into the Licca, in the Auftrian Territory, and that, after this Defeat, the Austrians had taken a Redoubt, with Four Iron Cannons. In the Evening of the 28th Ult. the Turks retreated towards Vakup.

The laft Accounts from Moldavia state, that the Prince of Saxe-Cobourg, with the Army under his Command, had reached Bakun; that the Ruffians were posted in the Environs of Gallacz ; that a confiderable Number of Turks were affembled near Fockschan, and that the Grand Vizir had arrived on the Banks of the Danube, opposite to Ismail.

Oftend, June 20.

An Imperial Ordinance was published on the 18th Inftant, by which all the Concessions and Privileges granted or confirmed by the Emperor to the Province of Brabant, as well as the whole Contents of the Joyense Entrie, are declared to be revoked and annulled; and a Supreme Council is established at Malines, in Lieu of the Provincial Council of Brabant, which is abolifhed.
