they had attempted to make into the Licca, in the Auftrian Territory, and that, after this Defeat, the Auftrians had taken a Redoubt, with Four Iron Cannons. In the Evening of the 28th Ult. the Turks retreated towards Vakup.

The laft Accounts from Moldavia state, that the Prince of Saxe-Cobourg, with the Army under his Command, had reached Bakun; that the Ruffians were posted in the Environs of Gallacz ; that a confiderable Number of Turks were affembled near Fockschan, and that the Grand Vizir had arrived on the Banks of the Danube, opposite to Ifmail.
