## Vienna, June 17.

The last Accounts from Laxembourg mention that the Emperor is rather better, his Fever continuing to abate, though it has not quite left him.

Intelligence has been received from Croatia, that, on the 10th of this Month Marshal Laudohn quitted his Camp at Sluin, and after leaving a Body of Troops to guard the Frontier most exposed to the Incurfions of the Enemy, proceeded with the Reft of his Army on his March for Turkish Gradisca, at which Place it was expected he would arrive in the Course of Nine Days.

Manner, and within the Time preferibed by the AE for better examining and Auditing the Public Accounts of this Kingdom, the Commissioners for Auditing the Public Accounts have directed that Copies of the fol-lowing Sections of the faid Act be inferted in the London Gazette, in order that all Persons to whom London Gazette, in oraer that all responses when. Public Money has been, or shall be, so issued, may be informed of the Confequences of such Neglect. Philip Deare, John Wigglesworth, Informed of Accounts.

# Inspectors-General of Accounts.

SECTION XVII. And whereas great Loffes and Inconveniences have arifen to the Public, by Sub-Accountants not having been put in Charge till a long Time has elapfed after the Monies were iffued to them, be it enacted, That the Paymafter-General of His Majefly's Forces, the Treafurer of the Navy, the Treafurer of the Ordnance, and every other Public Officer who shall hereafter pay into the Hands of any Person or Persons whomsoever, Money for Public Services, by Way of Imprest or on Account, shall, within Thirty Days of the 31st Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-five, and within Thirty Days of the 31st Day of December in every future Year, tranf-mit an Account of all Sums of Money iffued or paid by him or them to any Person or Person, for the Public Service, within the preceding Year, to the Commissioners to be appointed under the Authority of this Act; who shall, and they are hereby required forthwith to transmit Duplicates of the fame to His Majesty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall immediately, on Receipt of fuch Accounts, put the feveral Sums fo issued in Charge against the Parties, in like Manner as is now practifed with respect to Persons who receive Money by Way of Imprest, and on Account, at the Receipt of His Majesty's Exchequer.

SECTION XVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Accountant shall be allowed in his Account any Sum which he shall issue or pay over to any Sub-Accountants, unless he shall have transmitted to the faid Commissioners regular Accounts thereof, in the Manner and within the Times abovementioned; unless Proof shall be produced, to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treasurer, or the Commissioners of the Treasury, that any Failure of transmitting the fame did not happen from the wilful Neglect of the Perfon iffuing or paying over the Money as aforefaid. SECTION XX. And be it further enacted and

declared. That every Sub-Accountant to whom Money shall hereafter be issued for Public Services, in cafe the Money fo iffued shall have been for Services to be performed in Great Britain, shall deliver into the Office of the Commissioners to be appointed by virtue of this Act, the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, within Three Months of the End of each Year from the Commencement of his Account, unless it has been usual for such Account to be made up to any fixed Period in the Year; in which Cafe they shall be delivered within Three Months of the ufual annual Time of the Determination of each Account respectively; and in cafe such Monies shall have been issued for Services to be performed in any Part of Europe out of this Kingdom, then the Vouchers shall be delivered within Four

Months of the Expiration of each Year's Ac-counts; if in the Welt Indies, the Continent of America, or in Africa, within Six Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; and if in the East Indies, within Twelve Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; unless it shall in each and every Cafe be made appear to the Sa-tisfaction of the Commissioners of the Treasury, that the Failure of transmitting the fame, within the Periods beforementioned, was unavoidable; in which Cafe fuch further Delay may be granted by Warrant under the Hands of the Commissioners of the Treasury, or any Three of them, as they shall judge reasonable; and in such Cases the Vouchers shall be delivered at the Expiration of the Term of Delay fo granted, on Pain, upon Failure in any of the abovementioned Cafes, of paying fuch Fine to His Majefty as the Court of Exchequer. on Application made to them, shall think fit to fet and impose; which Fine the faid Court is hereby authorized and impowered to fet and impose accordingly.

SECTION XXII. Provided always, and be it enacted, that when any Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants shall transmit to the Commissioners, to be appointed under the Authority of this Act, a fufficient and fatisfactory Difcharge from the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, the Commiffioners of His Majelty's Navy, the Commiffioners for Victualling His Majelty's Navy, or the Commiffioners of Sick and Hurt, for any Monies he or they shall have received in the faid Departments feverally, the faid Commissioners shall transmit a Duplicate of the fame to His Majefly's Remem-brancer in the Court of Exchequer, who shall forthwith strike out the Name or Names of such Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants from the Imprest Roll; and fuch Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants shall from thenceforth be discharged from any other or further Account for the fame.
