HEIR Majefties and Their Royal High-neffes the Princets Royal, Princets Augulta and Prince's Elizabeth, arrived at Gloucefter-Houfe, in perfect Health, at a little after Four o'Clock Yelterday Afternoon. The Cannon at Portland Caftle were foon after fired, which were answered by His Majesty's Ships in the Roads, and by a Royal Salute from the Battery on Shore; and in the Evening the whole Town was very fplendidly illuminated.

This Day the Mayor and Corporation waited on Their Majesties with the following Address, which was received very gracioufly.

WE, the Mayor, Recorder, Aldermen, Bailiffs, Burgeffes and Commonalty of your Majesty's Borough and Town of Waymouth and Melcombe Regis, beg Leave to congratulate your Majefty on your fafe Arrival at this Place, and to acknowledge how fenfible we are of the high Honor done to us by your Majesty's Visit.

It is our anxious Hope that we shall not foon be deprived of that heart-felt Joy which the Prefence of our beloved Sovereign every where diffuses. The Sight of their Monarch is always grateful to a loyal People, but it is never more to than when, laying afide the awful Splendor of a Throne, he condefcends to appear amongst them, cloathed in the more pleasing, because better known, Characters of do-mestic Life.
