THEREAS the Select Committee appointed to try and determine the Merits of the Peti-tion of Sir Samuel Hood, Baronet, Lord Hood in the Kingdom of Ireland; and also the Petition of feveral Inhabitants, Houteholders of the City and Liberty of Westminster, paying Scot and Lot, whose Names are thereunto fubfcribed, being Electors of Members to represent the faid City and Liberty in Parliament, on Behalf of themselves and many other Electors of the faid City and Liberty, feverally complaining of an undue Election and Return for the faid City and Liberty, have this Day reported to the House of Commons, "That it appeared to the faid ** Select Committee, that the Merits of the Petitions " did in Part depend upon the Right of Election, " the Parties were therefore required to deliver in ⁴⁴ Statements in Writing of the Right of Election ⁴⁴ for which they refpectively contended; that ⁴⁴ in confequence thereof the Petitioner Lord ⁴⁴ Hood delivered in a Statement as follows: " The Petitioner Lord Hood states, that the Right " of Election for the City and Liberty of Westmin-" fter is in the Inhabitants, Householders paying ... Scot and Lot, within the united Parifhes of Saint " Margaret and Saint John, and the feveral Parifhes " of Saint Paul Covent-Garden, Saint Ann, Saint ⁴⁴ James, Saint George Hanover-Square, in the ⁴⁴ Liberty of Saint Martin-le-Grand in the County " of Middlefex, and in fo much of the Parishes of ** Saint Martin in the Fields, Saint Clement Danes, " and Saint Mary-le-Strand, as are not within any " of the Four Wards of the Liberty of the Duchy " of Lancatter, called the Temple-Bar Ward, the "Royal Ward, the Middle Ward, and Precinct of " the Savoy." That the Electors Petitioners de-" livered in a Statement as follows : " The Elec-" tors Petitioners state, that the Right of Election " for the City and Liberty of Westminster is in the " Inhabitants, Householders paying Scot and Lot, within the united Parishes of Saint Margaret and " Saint John, and the feveral Parifnes of Saint Paul Saint John, and the tototal random of James, Saint

That the Sitting Member Lord John " Townshend delivered in a Statement as follows : " The Right of Election is in the Inhabitants, " Houscholders of the Parishes of Saint Margaret " and Saint John, Saint George Hanover-Square, " Sai it James Weftminster, Saint Martin in the " Fields, Saint Clement Danes, Saint Mary-le-" Strand, Saint Mary-le-Savoy, Saint Paul Covent-"Garden, Saint Ann Soho, and the Diffrict of Saint Martin-le-Grand." That upon the State-" ments delivered in by the Petitioners the faid " Select Committee have determined, " That the " Right of Election for the City and Liberty of "Westminster is in the Inhabitants, Householders paying Scot and Lot, within the United Parifhes 66 " of Saint Margaret and Saint John, and the feveral " Parishes of Saint Paul Covent Garden, Saint Ann, "Saint James, Saint George Hanover-Square, in the Liberty of Saint Martin-le-Grand in the County of Mid defex, and in fo much of the Parifies of Saint Martin in the Fields, Saint Clement Danes, and Saint Mary-le-Strand, as
are not within any of the Four Wards of the
Liberty of the Duchy of Lancafter." That upon

" the Statement delivered in by the Sitting Mem-" ber the Committee have determined," That "ber the Committee have determined, "That "the Right of Election, as fet forth in the faid "Statement, is not the Right of Election for the faid City and Liberty of Weftminster."

Madrid, June 18.

An Edict was published here the Day before Yesterday for regulating the Ceremony of his Catholick Majesty's Coronation, which is fixed for the 21st of September next.

Vienna, June 24.

The Emperor's Health has been much better fince his Refidence at Laxembourg. His Imperial Majesty paffed Three or Four Days without Fever, and has recovered his Strength fo far as to be able to take the Air for the greateft Part of the Day in the Gar-dens of that Palace. On Sunday and Monday laft however his Majefty had a Return of his Fever, though not to any confiderable Degree. Intelligence has been received from Sciavonia,

that General Mitrowsky, with the Corps under his Command, had paffed the Save, for the Purpole of feconding the Operations of Marshal Laudohn against Gradisca.

The last Accounts from Transylvania state, that the Prince of Hohenlohe, after having been joined by a Corps of about 6000 Men, from the Grand Army in the Bannat, had left Hermanstadt, and had advanced towards the Frontier of Moldavia, from whence he had detached a Reinforcement to the Prince of Saxe-Cobourg at Bakou.

Paris, July 2.

The National Affembly met on Tuefday laft, according to the Adjournment from last Saturday, and proceeded to verify the Returns of all the Members in common, when the Majority of the Nobility protefted against any Refolutions of the Assembly till they receive further Instructions from their Constituents.
