Constantinople, June 15. Intelligence was received here the 11th Instant from Ruichiuck, that an Officer with the Imperial Commands had arrived there on the 5th, when the Grand Vizir, Suluf Palhaw, was depoled from that Office, and put under Arreit; and that his Papers were fealed up by the Janiflary Aga, acting as Kai-macham, or Locum Tenens of Haffan Pafhaw, of Vidin, now promoted to the Vizirate.

Madrid, July 6.

Her Catholick Majefty was fafely delivered of a Princefs this Evening at Six o'Clock. The two first Names given to her Royal Highnefs in Baptism were Maria-Isabella.

Vienna, July 15. The Emperor had no Return of his Fever either on Saturday or Sunday last, and his Majesty advances in his Recovery.

A Courier arrived here Yesterday Evening, with the Intelligence that the Turks having evacuated Gradifca in the Night of the 8th of this Month, the Auftrian Army took Poffeffion of that Fortrefs on the following Morning.

Paris, July 23. On Tuesday last the King received the Foreign Ministers as usual at Verfailles, when M. de Montmorin attended, and every Thing was quiet in that Quarter. M. de la Luzerne has refumed the Em-ployment from which he had been removed; but M. Necker is not yet arrived. This City has continued, under the Protection of

the Militia, perfectly free from all Kind of Tumult till Yefterday Evening, when two Executions took Place in the Place de Grêve. One of the unfortunate Per fons who fuffered was M. de Foulon, who had fpread the Report of his Death, and retired to his Houfe in the Country ; but being difcovered, he was forcibly brought to Paris. He was first hanged, his Head was then cut off, and carried upon a Pole to meet his Son-in-Law, M. Berthier, Intendant of Paris, whofe Death was also decided upon, and who had been feized at Compeigne. This Victim arrived at the Hotel de Ville, late Yesterday Evening, efforted by Sixteen Hundred Perfons, and, after a fhort Examination, which was interrupted by the Clamours of the Populace, fuffered a fimilar Fate, notwithstanding the Marquis de la Fayette endeavoured to perfuade the People to fave his Life.

It is reported that the Queen, accompanied by the Dauphin, is to come to Paris To-morrow, in order to go to the Church of Notre-Dame. The Accounts from Britanny mention that feveral

Regiments in different Parts of that Province laid down their Arms, upon being ordered out to quell Difturbances; and that at Have-de-Grace the whole Garrifon, upon receiving the News of what had hap-pened at Paris, marched out, and left the Forr and its Appendages to the Bourgeoifie, who immediately took Polleffion of it.
