The Emperor's Fever is considerably abated, and Yesterday His Majesty was so well as to be able to take an Airing in an open Carriage.

The last Intelligence received here mentions that Marshal Haddick still retained his Position at Weiffkirchen, from whence he had sent several Detachments to join the Prince of Hohenlohe, in Transylvania, as that Province was menaced with an Irruption of the Turks, who were assembled in considerable Force near Riminik, in Wallachia.

The Letters from Moldavia state that Prince Potemkin had arrived at Yaffy towards the End of last Month.
