THEIR Majesties, and their Royal Highnesses the Princesses, having set out from Weymouth at Eight o'Clock this Morning, arrived at the Deanry at Nine this Evening, in perfect Health.

Whitehall, August 15.

The King has been pleased to confer on Joseph Ewart, Esq; His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary at the Court of Berlin, the additional Character of Minister Plenipotentiary to that Court.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable John Earl of Chatham, Richard Hopkins, Esq; the Right Honourable Charles George Lord Arden, and Samuel Lord Hood, Vice-Admiral of the Blue, both of the Kingdom of Ireland, Sir Francis Drake, Bart. Rear-Admiral of the Red, the Right Honourable Robert Grosvenor, commonly called Lord Viscount Belgrave, and the Honourable John Thomas Townshend, to be His Majesty's Commissioners for executing the Office of High Admiral of the Kingdoms of Great Britain and Ireland, and the Dominions, Islands and Territories thereunto belonging.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable Constantine John Lord Mulgrave, of the Kingdom of Ireland, and the Right Honourable James Graham, commonly called Marquess of Graham, to be Receiver and Paymaster General of His Majesty's Guards, Garrisons and Land Forces.

The King has been pleased to grant to William Bulcock, Gentleman, and his Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to take and use the Surname of Belcombe; and also to order that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.

The humble Address of the Vice-Consul, Factory and British Residents on the Island of Madeira.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Vice-Consul, Factory and British Residents of the Island of Madeira, beg Leave to present our

sincere and joyful Congratulations on the happy Re-establishment of your Majesty's Health.

Though prevented by our Situation from immediately sharing in those Blessings eminently enjoyed by every British Subject in your Majesty's Dominions, yet no Distance can lessen the Loyalty of our Attachment to your Majesty's Government, nor diminish the Warmth of our Affection for your Majesty's Royal Person.

We acknowledge with Gratitude the Goodness of Almighty God, in that it hath pleased Him, in His Divine Mercy, to restore your Majesty to the full Exercise of the Regal Power; and we earnestly pray that your Majesty's precious Life may long be preserved, to dispense Blessings to a free, a loyal, and an affectionate People.
