Plymouth Dock, August 27.

HIS Morning the King, with the Queen and Three Princess, left Saltram on their Return to Weymouth, after a Stay of Twelve Days; during which Time Their Majesties, accompanied by the Princess, and attended by the Board of Admiralty, viewed the Dock-Yard, the Ships building and repairing, and those on float; went on board the Impregnable, a Guardship of 90 Guns, and the Royal Sovereign, a new Ship of 100 Guns in Ordinary; and proceeded to Sea in the Southampton Frigate, (accompanied by the Magnificent of 74 Guns) to review the Squadron of Evolution, under the Command of Commodore Goodall, which was cruizing in the Offing.

His Majefty also inspected the Victualling-Office; and afterwards took a View of the Citadel, Gun-Wharf and Works on the Heights near Causand Bay, accompanied by the Master-General of the Ordnance, and the Governor of the Garrison.

His Majefty's Barge was conftantly attended by the Board of Admiralty, the Rear-Admiral commanding in the Port, and the Captains of the Ships, under his Command, in their refpective Barges; and the Royal Standard, whenever it appeared in Sight, was faluted by His Majefty's Ships, and by the Guns at the Citadel, Drake's Island, and the feveral Batteries on Shore.

His Majefly expressed the higheft Approbation of the good Order and Discipline of the Fleet; of the excellent Condition of the Dock Yard, Arfenals and Garrifon, and the Regularity with which every Thing was conducted; and shewed the utmost Satiffaction at the Demonstrations of Loyalty and Attention with which He was received by all Ranks of People, who affembled in great Numbers from every Quarter, to enjoy the Happinels of feeing their Sovereign amongs them.

The King was Yeflerday gracioufly pleafed to cenfer the Honor of Knighthood on Thomas Byard, Efq; Captain of the Impregnable, who had the Honor, each Day, to fleer His Majefly's Barge; and alio to direft that the Commanders of the Termagant and Wafp Sloops be promoted to the Rank of Poft Captains in His Majefly's Fleet; the Lieutenants commanding the Speedwell and Brazen Cutters, and the Firft Lieutenants of the Barfleur, Impregnable, Carnatic, Bombay Caftle, Magnificent, and Southampton, to the Rank of Mafters and Commanders; and that Twelve Midshipmen be made Lieutenants.

Conflantinople, July 8.

The Plague broke out again last Week in the Naval Arfenal, and particularly in the Quarter inhabited by the Slaves and Prifoners, and still continues: It alio rages in a great Degree at Smyrna.

Viena, August 15. His Imperial Majesty, as a Mark of his Approbation, has conferred on the Prince of Saxe-Cobourg the Great Crois of the Military Order of Maria The refa, has fent a Snuff-Box, richly ornamented with Diamonds, to the Ruffian General Sutarow, and has promoted feveral of the Officers who had diftinguished themfelves in the late Action.

The Prince of Saxe-Cobourg has advanced his Head Quarters into Wallachia, between Fockschan and Rimnik.

Hague, August 21.

Accounts have been received here from Liege that, on the 18th Inftant, a tumultuous Affembly of the Inhabitants of that City, and its Diffrict, had furrounded the Palace of the Prince Bishop, and extorted his Affent to different Demands; one of which was that the States General of that Principality fhould be forthwich affembled.

An Express arrived here also this Morning from Maestricht, with Intelligence that a Body of feveral Thousand Rioters had assembled in the Neighbourhood of Verviers, and had committed various Outrages; but it does not appear what was the immediate Motive or Pretext for this Infurrection.

Whitehall, August 24, 1789.

WHEREAS it has been humbly reprefented to the King, that various Riots and Difturbances broke out on or about the 29th Day of July last, and continued for feveral fuccesfive Days, in the Town and Neigh-bourhood of Wrexham, in the County of Denbigh; in the Course of which several Waggons were stopped and plundered, Boats destroyed, and Corn forcibly taken and fold for less than the current Price, by fome evil-difposed Person or Persons unknown.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bring-ing to Justice the Persons concerned in the unlawful Proceedings abovementioned, is hereby pleased to promile His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, fo that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof :

And, as a further Encouragement, His Majefty is alfo pleafed to offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Perfon making fuch Difcovery as aforefaid, to be paid by the Lords Commiffioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.
