#### Whitehall, September 8.

AS feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the follow-ing Abstracts of Alts of Parliament of their late Majesties, King George the First and Second, and of His present M. ijesty, for preventing fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them.—And it will be objerved, that fuch Penalties likewife extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

#### Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Weltminster, or at the Amzes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Perfon having been once convicted, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and imprisoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be

Subjects in any fuch Foreign Coantry, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Bri-tain, in the Country where such Artificers shall be, or by any Perlon authorifed by fuch Ambaffador, arc. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor for Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defceat, De-vife or Purchafe; and thall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ufe, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majelty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Justice of Peace that any Person is endeavouring to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-faid; fuch Justice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice; and if it fhall appear by the Oath of one Witness, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Juffice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions : And if fuch Perfon shall refule to give Security, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall be delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpole aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majefty's Dominions, as fuch Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Jufficiary, or the Circuits there.

p2:d. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, fhall go into any Country out of His Ma-jefly's Dominions, to exercife or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or 207

any other Artificer in any other of the Manufac- | tures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein fuch Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted thall, for every Ar-tificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Imprifonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid : And in Cafe of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Person contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender fhall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forseiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in. or proper for the Preparing, Working up er Finishing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he shall for every Offance forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weltminster, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Essoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to some other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Vessel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Vessel, he shall for every such Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majefty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majefty

If any Officer of the Cultoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly

fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Expering of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly affer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty.

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the fame.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefty.

BY these Statutes the like Penalties and For-feitures as above mentioned are extended to Persons packing or putting on board any Vessel, not bound directly for some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever ufed in, or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines ceiving or being in Possession of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Cuftom-house Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils used in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
