*Vienna,* June 9. Several Gentlemen belonging to the Duke of *Newburg*, are arrived here, and they say their Master is not far behind; they left him at *Oettingen* in *Bavaria*, with intention to follow them in a day or two. The Dispensation necessary is arrived from *Rome*, for the celebrating the Marriage between the Archduchess *Anne* and the Prince of *Newburg*. The Rebels in *Hungary* continue to give out that they will very suddenly attempt some place, which they may make their Magazine; but we are confident the General of the Imperial Forces will be sufficiently able to disappoint any design they may have. It is said that the Emperor hath called the Propositions which have been made at *Worms* for a Peace to be communicated to the Diet at *Ratisbona*. From *Poland* we are assured that the Peace between that Crown and the *Poles* is Ratified by the Grand Signior, which the *Moscovites* are not pleased with, who had promised themselves the assistance of the *Poles* in the War they are likely to have with the *Turks*, of which they not only find themselves disappointed, but likewise, that all the occasion of misunderstanding between the *Turks* and the *Poles* is now taken away.

From the Imperial Camp about a League from Fri-  
burg, June 16. The 13 instant, before break of  
day, we decamped very silently from *Buckberg*, and  
approached to *Bucken*, without that the Enemy knew  
of it, who might otherwise have disputed our pas-  
sage over the River *Elz*, and through certain Woods;  
but so soon as the *Marschal de Crequi* had notice of  
it, he likewise decamped and marched to *Stunzig*,  
right over against us, and there posted himself, se-  
veral skirmishes happening, in which some persons  
of note were killed on both sides. The French  
have received a reinforcement of 15 Standards, and  
we begin to talk of a Cessation of Arms. Count  
*Mansfelt* is arrived in the Camp from *Kienna*.

*Amstelredam June 19.* The two Armies having for se-  
veral days lay'd within three quarters of a League  
of each other, the Enemies night being encamped  
near the Castle of *Hochberg*, and their left reaching  
beyond the Village of *Evensingen*, where they had  
their head-quarters, and our Army being posted along  
the small River, on which is *Langendantz-Lingen*,  
the two Armies being only thus separated by a small  
Brook, which was everywhere fordable, and by  
some Woods, easy to pass; the 22, at night, the  
Imperial Army decamped, and passing the River  
*Elz*, posted themselves at *Bucken*, which stands on a  
Rivulet that comes from *Friburg*, having *Newburg* on  
their left. The same day the *Marschal de Crequi*  
decamped from *Langendantz-Lingen*, and posted his  
Army at *Leben* near *Friburg* etc. Enemies design be-  
ing to have possessed themselves of the Hills which  
are near that place, had they not been prevented.  
The *Marschal de Crequi* has left the *Baron de Mo-  
ncelar* at *Langendantz-Lingen*, to preserve that Post,  
and at 9 o'clock the communication with *Willingen*.  
The 23 a great Convoy passed from this City to  
the French Camp, without any opposition. The  
*Marquis de Rossy* continues posted with 3000 men  
at the Abby of *Val St. Pierre*, where he has forti-  
fied himself; that Valley furnishes our Troops with  
great quantities of Forage. The Imperialists have a  
Body of 6000 men two Leagues from thence, and  
another towards *Rhinfelds*, where they are making  
a Bridge of Boats to bring down the *Rhine* to *Hun-  
ningen*. The 25, the detachment from *Flanders*,  
consisting in 24 Squadrons and 10 Battalions, is ex-  
pected in the French Camp.

*Amstelredam June 21.* The hopes we have of a  
sudden Peace increase daily, and some people are  
of opinion, that it will not be very long ere we hear  
of its being concluded. From *Nimeguen* they write  
that they were expecting there the return of the  
Express which the Imperial Ambassadors had sent to  
*Kienna*, to give the Emperor an account of the Ces-  
sation of Arms being agreed to by France, and of  
the dispositions they found in those parts, to which  
the said Courier will it's believed bring back the  
Emperors mind upon these matters. 21 17

*Hittin June 24.* From the *Hague* we have an ac-  
count, that the States have taken a final resolution  
in the matter of the Peace, and that orders are sent  
to their Ambassadors at *Nimeguen*, to proceed to  
conclude and sign it. They have likewise nominated  
the *Heer de Sanoy* Commander at *Utrecht* to go to  
the French Court, to give that King the knowledge  
of what they have done.

*Hague, June 24.* On Wednesday the States of  
*Holland*, after having read the Letters received  
from their Ambassadors at *Nimeguen*, giving an ac-

count, among other things, of the Conference they  
had had with the Ministers of the Alliance upon the  
subject of the Peace, came to a final resolution con-  
cerning it, after which they went in body with his  
Highness, to the Assembly of the States General,  
to communicate to them the resolution they  
had taken, which after some debate, the Extraor-  
dinary Deputies of the six other Provinces being  
there present, they concurred with them in. Af-  
ter in the evening the Deputies of the State had a  
Conference with *Don Manuel de Lyra* the Spanish Mi-  
nister. This morning early the States of *Holland*  
were again assembled for several hours, and then  
went with his Highness, as they had done the day  
before in body, to the Assembly of the States Ge-  
neral; in the evening another Conference was held  
with the Spanish Minister, after which the States  
General met again at seven a clock, and continued  
together till midnight, and then parted, after having on  
their part put the last hand to this great work, which  
is to be finished at *Nimeguen*, whither the *Heer  
Odyke*, one of the Ambassadors of this State, parts  
to morrow with the necessary Dispatches; and we  
are told that the States have written a Letter to  
the Most Christian King, and another to the Duke  
of *Luxemburg*, with commands to the French Army  
in *Flanders*, to acquiesce therein with the resolution  
they have taken. This day four persons were ex-  
ecuted here for having been the principal Authors of  
the late disorders at *Sardath* 27 16 1 0 3

*Ditto.* The *Heer Odyke* parts this noon for *Ni-  
meguen*, whither an Express was sent the last night,  
with Letters to the *Heer Beverwyck*, and this morn-  
ing about 11 a clock the *Heer de Sanoy* parted hence  
Post on his way to the French Court, being sent  
by the States to acquaint his Majesty with the Re-  
solutions they have taken to conclude the Peace upon  
the Conditions proposed. It is said that an Ex-  
press is sent to the *Sieur Evaras*, who commands the  
Dutch Squadron in the *Straits*, to give him notice  
of the state and tendency things here are in towards  
a Peace, and to bring him, as is believed, not to  
enter upon any hostility, after the receipt of these  
Letters, against the French.

*Amstelredam June 24.* The King, as we are inform-  
ed, has sent orders to the *Marschal de Navailles*  
to demolish *Puyssard*, and to quit *Urgel*, and another  
Post which he had taken; and to cease all further  
hostility against the Spaniards; and at the same time  
orders have been likewise sent to the *Sieur du  
Quefne*, to return with the Men of *Wab* and *Gallies*  
with which he is at present crossing on the Coast of  
*Catalonia*, to *Thoulon*. The Letters we receive from  
*Germany*, gives us an account, that the Imperial Ar-  
my decamped the 13 instant, and marched to *Bucken*;  
and that the *Marschal de Crequi* and his post likewise  
removed to *Leben*; that they were very near each  
other, and that several skirmishes happened daily  
between their Parties. The King has declared that the  
Dauphin shall for the future be present in the Coun-  
cil, to instruct him betimes in the affairs of the State.
