Whitehall, September 12.
THE King has been pleased to constitute and appoint the Right Honourable Lord Walsingham, and the Earl of Westmorland, to be His Majesty's Postmaster-General.

The King has been pleased to grant to the Earl of Chesterfield the Office of Master of His Majesty's Mint.

The King has been pleased to constitute and appoint Timothy Caswall, Esq; to be one of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Revenue of Excise in England, in the Room of Anthony Lucas, Esq; deceased.

Madrid, August 24.

An Edict of His Catholic Majesty has just been published here, by which the Trade to the Port of Manila, hitherto confined to the Asiatic Nations, is opened for the Term of Three Years, to commence from the 1st of September, 1790, to the Ships of all the European Powers, which are allowed to carry thither any Asiatic Produce (the Importation of European Goods in Foreign Bottoms remaining strictly prohibited) and to export from thence Silver, and all Spanish Merchandize, as well as such Foreign Articles as may have been conveyed to that Port by the Philippine Company, on the same Terms as this Trade is permitted to the Asiatic Nations.

Vienna, August 29.

The Emperor was Yesterday so much better as to have been able to remain out of his Bed for more than Two Hours. As the Environs of Laxembourg, and even the Gardens of that Palace, are entirely overflowed, in consequence of the present Inundations, it is expected that His Imperial Majesty will return to this Capital, as soon as he is able to bear the Motion of a Carriage.

On the 19th Instant died at Trieste, after a short Illness, in the Sixty-fifth Year of his Age, his Excellency Peter Langlois, General of Infantry, Colonel-

Proprietor of the Regiment of Infantry bearing his Name, Commander in Chief of Anterior Aultria, Governor of Antwerp, and Commandant at Trieste.

His Prussian Majesty arrived this Morning at Charlottenburg from Silesia, in perfect Health.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, all Manufactures of and Dealers in Tobacco or Snuff are required, Three Days before the 10th Day of October next, to make true and particular Entry at the nearest Office of Excise, of all Houses, Warehouses, Shops, Rooms, Cellars, Vaults and other Places intended to be made Use of for the manufacturing, keeping or selling Tobacco or Snuff; and also of the several Implements, Engines or Utensils for manufacturing the same; and such Manufacturers or Dealers are also required to take out Licences for manufacturing of or dealing in Tobacco or Snuff; and are further required, on or before the 30th Day of September instant, to deliver, or cause to be delivered upon Oath, at the nearest Office of Excise, according to the Terms of the said Act, a particular Account of the Weight of the several Quantities of Tobacco, Tobacco Stalks, Spanish Tobacco Stalk Flour, and Snuff, which shall be in their Custody or Possession on the said 30th Day of September instant:—Notice is hereby given, that the several Offices of Excise will be open every Day (Sundays and Holidays excepted) for the Receipt of such Entries and Accounts; that Licences will be ready to be delivered at this Office to such Persons resident within the Limits thereof, as shall apply for and be entitled to the same; and that the several Collectors of Excise throughout England and Wales will likewise be ready to deliver Licences to such Persons as shall apply to them for, and be entitled to the same.

at Kinnaird's Head, near Fraserburgh, Lat. 57 Deg. 42 Min. and Long. West of London 1 Deg. 20 Min. Cairnbulg from the Light-house bearing S. E. and Troup Point W. N. W.

The Lantern is 120 Feet above the Sea at High Water, and will be seen from S. E. from W. N. W. and intermediate Points of the Compass North of these two Points.
