Paris, September 17.

The National Assembly having declared itself permanent, and resolved upon it's Unity, has fixed the Term of Duration of each Branch of the Legislature at Two Years. The Assembly has granted to the King the suspending *Veto* only; but it is not yet determined whether his Majesty is to withhold his Sanction to any Act for one or more Sessions.
