

Whitehall, August 24, 1789.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that various Riots and Disturbances broke out on or about the 29th Day of July last, and continued for several successive Days, in the Town and Neighbourhood of Wrexham, in the County of Denbigh; in the Course of which several Waggon's were stopped and plundered, Boats destroyed, and Corn forcibly taken and sold for less than the current Price, by some evil-disposed Person or Persons unknown :

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the unlawful Proceedings above-mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof :

And, as a further Encouragement, His Majesty is also pleased to offer a Reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid, to be paid by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, upon the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders.

APPRENTICE DUTY INDEMNITY.

Stamp-Office, Somerset-Place, Aug. 22, 1789.

HIS Majesty's Commissioners for Managing the Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by a Clause in an Act of the last Session of Parliament, it is enacted, for the Relief of all Persons who have omitted to pay the several Rates and Duties, or any Part thereof, upon Monies given, paid, or contracted for, with Clerks, Apprentices or Servants, and also who have omitted to insert and write in Words at Length in Indentures or other Writings relating to the Service of any Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, the full Sum or Sums of Money, or any Part thereof, received or contracted for, with or in Relation to, every such Clerk, Apprentice or Servant, that upon Payment of double the Rates and Duties upon the Monies, or such Part of the Monies, so omitted or neglected to be paid, and also so omitted to be inserted and written in such Indenture or Writing, before the 25th Day of December next, to the proper Officer, and tendering the same to be stamped at this Office, every such

Indenture, or other Writing, shall be good and valid, and the Person so offending be excused from any Penalty incurred by the Omission thereof; except those against whom any Prosecution shall be now depending.
