P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**H**IS Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, That the Parliament, which stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-ninth Day of this instant October, should be further prorogued to Thursday the Tenth Day of December next.

This Day the Right Honourable John Earl of Westmorland was, by His Majesty's Command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to declare the Right Honourable John Earl of Westmorland Lieutenant General and General Governor of His Majesty's Kingdom of Ireland.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Thomas Earl of Effingham Captain General and Governor in Chief of the Island of Jamaica, and the Territories depending thereon, his Lordship this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken by the Governors of His Majesty's Plantations.

mission to offer at the Foot of the Throne dutiful Congratulations on the Recovery of your Majesty from that Severity of Disease to which it has been the Will of the Almighty Disposer of Human Events that your Royal Person should be lately subjected.

None of your faithful Subjects, most gracious Sovereign, in the Hour of public Apprehension, were impressed with greater Anxiety, and none, on the Restoration of your Majesty to the Exercise of Regal Authority, have more sincerely rejoiced. Long may your Majesty continue to reign the Father of the British Nation, and may there never be wanting on the British Throne a Prince of your Illustrious House, who shall emulate the Virtues of your Majesty, by founding his own Happiness on that of the Public.
