THIS Day being the Anniversary of the King's Accession to the Throne, when His Majesty entered into the Thirtieth Year of His Reign, the Guns in the Park and at the Tower were fired at One o'Clock; and in the Evening there were Illuminations, and other Public Demonstrations of Joy, in London and Westminster.

The King has been pleased to declare and ordain, by His Royal Sign Manual, that Cecil Hamilton, Daughter of the Honourable and Reverend George Hamilton, Master of Arts, and Canon of Windsor, deceased, Brother of the Right Honourable James Earl of Abercorn, also deceased, shall have and enjoy the same Place, Preheminence and Precedency, in all Assemblies or Meetings whatsoever, as the Daughter of an Earl of the Kingdom of Great Britain; and His Majesty has also been pleased to order that the same be registered in the College of Arms.

Vienna, October 12.

Major-General Klebeck arrived here early this Morning with the News of the Surrender of the Fortrefs of Belgrade to the Austrians, on the 8th Instant. The Particulars are not yet published.

The National Assembly commenced Business at the Archbishop's Palace on Monday last.

Whitehall, October 26, 1789.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Saturday the 17th Instant, about Midnight, the Dwelling-House of General Charles Vernon, situate at Hampstead, in the County of Middlesex, was burglariously attempted to be broke into and entered, by some evil-disposed Persons unknown, armed with Pistols and Bludgeons, who actually stole a Quantity of Plate through a Casement, but were deterred from proceeding in the Robbery by the Noise

they made alarming one of the Servants of the said General Vernon, who discharged a Blunderbuss in the Midst of the said Villains, by which one of them was very much wounded, as appeared by the Quantity of Blood discoverea in the Track by which they made their Escape; that in their Flight they left behind them the Plate they had stolen, together with a Horse Pistol loaded with Slugs, mounted with Brass, and a Bludgeon stained with Blood; and further, that on Monday Evening the 19th Instant, soon after the Return of the said General Vernon in his Carriage from Town, as one of the Footmen who attended him, (being the Servant who discharged the Blunderbuss at the Thieves as above mentioned) was passing from one of the back Offices towards the said Dwelling-House, he was fired at with a Pistol (as supposed by the Report) loaded with Ball, by some Person unknown, but fortunately escaped unhurt, and two of the Balls entered the Door of the said Dwelling-House.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the several felonious Offences above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually fired at the Footman as aforesaid) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
