St. James's, October 28. HE King was this Day pleafed to confer the Honour of Knighthood on Afhton Wardeneral for the Island of Grenada.

### Whiteball; October 31.

The King has been pleafed to conflitute and ap-point Ilay Campbell, of Succoth, Efq; His Majefty's Advocate for Scotland, to be Prefident of the College of Justice in Scotland, in the Room of Sir Tho-mas Miller, Bart. deceased.

The King has also been pleased to constitute and appoint Robert Dundas, of Arniston, Esq; to be His Majesty's Advocate for Scotland.

The King has allo been pleafed to conftitute and appoint Robert Blair, Efq; Advocate, to be His Ma-jefty's Sollicitor for Scotland.

Lord Chamberlain's Office, October 31, 1789. NOtice is herchy given, That His Majefty will have a Levee at St. James's on Wednelday next, the 4th of November, and a Drawing Room there on Thursday next, the 5th of November.

Dublin Cafile, October 27, 1789. Sunday laft being the Anniverfary of His Majefly's happy Acceffion to the Throne, in the Morning the Flag was difplayed on Bedford Tower, at Noon the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majefly's Park the Phœnix were fired Three Rounds, and answered by Vollies from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up in the Royal Square at the Barracks. And Yesterday Evening a Play was given by Order of their Excellencies the Lords Justices for the Entertain-ment of the Ladies; and at Night there were Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.

Vienna, October 14. The Emperor went in State, this Morning, to the Cathedral Church, to affift at the Te Deum fung for the Surrender of Belgrade.

His Imperial Majesty has sent a Diamond Star of the Order of Maria Theresa to Marshal Laudohn. Els has also conferred the Great Crofs of that Order on Marshal Pellegrini, and appointed the Prince de I. gue to be a Commandeur of it. The two Generals or Infantry, Michael Wallis and Joseph Colloredo, have been promoted to the Rank of Field Marshals.

WHEREAS it has been bumbly reprefented to the King, that on Saturday the 17th Instant, about Midnight, the Dwelling-House of General Charles

Vernon, fituate at Hampstead, in the County of Middefex, was burglarioully attempted to be broke into and entered, by fome evol-difpofed Perfons unknown, armed with Piftols and Bludgeons, who actually fiole a Quantity of Plate through a Cafement, but were deterred from proceeding in the Robbery by the Noife they made alarming one of the Servants of the Jaid General Vernon, who difcharged a Blunderbufs in the Midd of the Coid Villains by gubich one of them guas Midft of the faid Villains, by which one of them was very much wounded, as appeared by the Quantity of Blood difcoverea in the Track by which they made their Escape ; that in their Flight they left behind them the Plate they had stolen, together with a Horse Pistol loaded with Slugs, mounted with Brass, and a Blud-geon stained with Blood; and further, that on Monday Evening the 19th Instant, foon after the Return of the faid General Vernon in his Carriage from Town, as one of the Footmen who attended him, (being the Servant who discharged the Blunderbuss at the Thieves

Servant who discharged the Blunderbuss at the Thieves as above mentioned) was passing from one of the back Offices towards the said Dwelling-House, he was fired at with a Pistel (as supposed by the Report) loaded with Ball, by some Person unknown, but fortunately escaped unburt, and two of the Balls entered the Door of the said Dwelling-House. His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bring-ing to Justice the Persons concerned in the several felonious Offences above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who actually fired at the Foot-man as aforesaid) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be ap-prehended and convisited thereos.
