St. James's, November 11.

THIS Day the Baron de Kutzleben, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary from his Serene Highness the Landgrave of Hesse-Cassel, had his Audience of Leave of His Majesty.

To which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Leeds, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell Dormer, Knt. Master of the Ceremonies.

Whitehall, November 13, 1789.

His Majesty having been pleased to order a Writ commanding John William Rose, of the Inner Temple, London, Esq; and Recorder of the City of London aforesaid, to take upon him the State and Degree of a Serjeant at Law, he this Day appeared at the Bar of the Court of Chancery; where his Writ being read, the usual Oaths were administered to him, and he afterwards went through the other necessary Ceremonies in the Court of Common Pleas.
