The Cups in the Shield at the Bottom of the Device are confiderably smaller than in the real

The Roman Letter at the No appears to be inferted with a Printing Type, and is large and coarse, nor has any Resemblance to the Letter in the real Note.

The Engraver's Name Kirkwood is printed Kirkwoob.

The Subscriptions are fo badly imitated, that the Imposition is observable on a very slight Inspection. But besides other Differences, which are nunecessary to mention, the Forgery is on common Paper, so that by holding it up to the Light, it may at once be detected by its wanting the Water Mark of Paisley

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Saturday the 17th Instant, about Midnight, the Dwelling-House of General Charles Vernon, situate at Hampstead, in the County of Middlesex, was burglariously attempted to be broke into and entered, by some ewil-disposed Persons unknown, armed with Pistols and Bludgeons, who actually stole a Quantity of Plate through a Casement, but were deterred from proceeding in the Robbery by the Noise they made alarming one of the Servants of the said General Vernon, who discharged a Blunderbuss in the Midst of the said Villains, by which one of them was very much wounded, as appeared by the Quantity of Blood discovered in the Track by which they made their Escape; that in their Flight they left behind them the Place they had stolen, together with a Horse Pistol loaded with Slugs, mounted with Brass, and a Blud-geon stained with Blood; and surther, that on Monday Evening the 19th Instant, soon after the Return of the faid General Vernon in his Carriage from Town, as one of the Footmen who attended him, (being the Servant who discharged the Blunderbuss at the Thieves as above mentioned) was passing from one of the back Offices towards the said Dwelling-House, he was fired at with a Pistol (as supposed by the Report) loaded with Ball, by some Person unknown, but fortunately escaped unburt, and two of the Balls entered the Door

of the faid Dwelling-House.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the several felonious Offences above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who adually fired at the Foot-man as asoresaid) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be ap-prehended and convicted thereof.
