The Engraving in general is not fo well executed, nor the Letters fo clean and regular as in the genuine Note.

The Cups in the Shield at the Bottom of the Device are confiderably fmaller than in the real Note.

The Roman Letter at the Nº appears to be inferted with a Printing Type, and is large and coarse, nor has any Resemblance to the Letter in the real Note.

The Engraver's Name Kirkwood is printed Kirkwoob.

The Subscriptions are fo badly imitated, that the Imposition is observable on a very flight Infpection. But befides other Differences, which are nnneceffary to mention, the Forgery is on common. Paper, fo that by holding it up to the Light, is. may at once be detected by its wanting the Water Mark of Paifley
