PROCLAMATION. A GEORGE R

HEREAS Our Parliament flands pro-rogued to Thursday the Tenth Day of December next: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish

and declare, That the faid Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the faid Tenth Day of December next, to Thursday the Twenty-first Day of January next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commiflion for proroguing the fame accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleafure, That the faid Parliament shall, on the faid Twenty-first Day of January next, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords weighty and important Affairs. Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgeffes, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the Houfe of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly, at Weft-minster, on the faid .Twenty-first Day of January next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twentyfifth Day of November, One thousand feven hundred and eighty-nine, in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.
