A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the Tenth Day of December next: We, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, That the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said Tenth Day of December next, to Thursday the Twenty-first Day of January next: And We have given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do hereby further declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, That the said Parliament shall, on the said Twenty-first Day of January next, be held for the Dispatch of divers weighty and important Affairs. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burghes, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are hereby required to give Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Twenty-first Day of January next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the Twenty-fifth Day of November, One thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine, in the Thirtieth Year of Our Reign.
