AT the Council-Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 2d of December, 1789,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by Order in Council of the 25th of June, 1788, the Importation of Wheat of the Growth of any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, was prohibited, until His Majesty's Pleasure should be further signified: And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that it appears, by Accounts received from His Majesty's Consul General at New York, and by the Information of several Merchants of the City of London, and others, trading to America, that the Hessian Fly, by which the Wheat of the Growth of the Territories of the said United States of America was infected in former Years, had this Season wholly disappeared: His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, That the said Prohibition, laid by Order in Council of the 25th of June, 1788, be, and the same is hereby, taken off. — And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.
