AT the Council-Chamber, Whitehall, the 2d of December, 1789,

P R E S E N T,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS, by Order in Council of the 25th of June, 1788, the Importation of Wheat of the Growth of any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, was prohibited, until His Majesty's Pleasure should be further signified: And whereas it hath been represented to His Majesty at this Board, that it appears, by Accounts received from His Majesty's Consul General at New York, and by the Information of several Merchants of the City of London, and others, trading to America, that the Hessian Fly, by which the Wheat of the Growth of the Territories of the said United States of America was infected in former Years, had this Season wholly disappeared: His Majesty, taking the same into Consideration, is pleased, with the Advice of His Privy Council, to order, That the said Prohibition, laid by Order in Council of the 25th of June, 1788, be, and the same is hereby, taken off.— And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary Directions herein accordingly.

The King has also been pleased to grant to Alexander Leith, of Leith Hall, in the County of Aberdeen, Esq; Lieutenant-Colonel of His Majesty's late 104th Regiment of Foot, His Royal Licence and Authority that he and his Issue may assume, use and bear the Surname of Hay only, without any Addition thereto, and also use and bear the proper Arms and Designation of the Family of Hay, of Rannes, only, without any Addition thereto, as their own Coat Armorial, in Compliance with the Will of his Great Uncle, Andrew Hay, late of Rannes, Esq; deceased;

such Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the Heralds Office:

And also to order that these His Majesty's several Concessions and Declarations be registered in His College of Arms.
