*Dublin Castle, January 5, 1790.*

His Excellency the Earl of Westmorland, Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom, embarked on Board His Majesty's Yacht the Dorset, at Holyhead, Yesterday, at Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon, and arrived early this Morning off Howth, where his Excellency landed about Nine o'Clock, and proceeded to the Seat of the Earl of Howth. A Squadron of Horse was immediately dispatched thither, and attended his Excellency to this City. The Infantry of the Garrison lined the Streets through which his Excellency passed on his Way to the Castle, and upon his Arrival there he was introduced in Form to the Lords Justices, who received him under the Canopy of State in the Presence Chamber; from whence a Procession was made in the usual State to the Council Chamber. The Council sitting, his Excellency's Commission was read, and the Oaths being administered to him, his Excellency was invested with the Collar of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, and received the Sword of State from the Lords Justices. The great Guns in His Majesty's Phoenix Park were then fired, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments on Duty. His Excellency afterwards repaired to the Presence Chamber, and received the Compliments of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction upon his safe Arrival, and taking upon him the Government of this Kingdom.

*WHEREAS* divers Persons, to whom Money has been iſſued for Public Services, have neglected to deliver into this Office the Vouchers for the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, in the Manner, and within the Time preſcribed by the Act for better examining and Auditing the Public Accounts of this Kingdom, the Commiſſioners for Auditing the Public Accounts have directed that Copies of the following Sections of the ſaid Act be inſerted in the London Gazette, in order that all Perſons to whom Public Money has been, or ſhall be, ſo iſſued, may be informed of the Conſequences of ſuch Neglect.

SECTION XVII. And whereas great Loſſes and Inconveniencies have ariſen to the Public, by Sub-Accountants not having been put in Charge till a long Time has elapſed after the Monies were iſſued to them, be it enacted, That the Paymaſter-General of His Maſteſty's Forces, the Treafurer of the Navy, the Treafurer of the Ordnance, and every other Public Officer who ſhall hereafter pay into the Hands of any Perſon or Perſons whomſoever, Money for Public Services, by Way of Impreſt or on Account, ſhall, within Thirty Days of the 31ſt Day of December, One thouſand ſeven hundred and eighty-five, and within Thirty Days of the 31ſt Day of December in every future Year, tranſmit an Account of all Sums of Money iſſued or paid by him or them to any Perſon or Perſons, for the Public Service, within the preceding Year, to the Commiſſioners to be appointed under the Authority of this Act; who ſhall, and they are hereby required forthwith to tranſmit Duplicates of the ſame to His Maſteſty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who ſhall immediately, on Receipt of ſuch Accounts, put the ſeveral Sums ſo iſſued in Charge againſt the Parties, in like Manner as is now practiſed with reſpect to Perſons who receive Money by Way of Impreſt, and on Account, at the Receipt of His Maſteſty's Exchequer.

SECTION XVIII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Accountant ſhall be allowed in his Account any Sum which he ſhall iſſue or pay over to any Sub-Accountants, unleſs he ſhall have tranſmitted to the ſaid Commiſſioners regular Accounts thereof, in the Manner and within the Times abovementioned; unleſs Proof ſhall be produced, to the Satisfaction of the Lord High Treafurer, or the Commiſſioners of the Treafury, that any Failure of tranſmitting the ſame did not happen from the wilful Neglect of the Perſon iſſuing or paying over the Money as aforeſaid.

SECTION XX. And be it further enacted and declared, That every Sub-Accountant to whom Money ſhall hereafter be iſſued for Public Services, in caſe the Money ſo iſſued ſhall have been for Services to be performed in Great Britain, ſhall deliver into the Office of the Commiſſioners to be appointed by virtue of this Act, the Vouchers for

the Expenditure thereof, together with an Account Current, within Three Months of the End of each Year from the Commencement of his Account, unleſs it has been uſual for ſuch Account to be made up to any fixed Period in the Year; in which Caſe they ſhall be delivered within Three Months of the uſual annual Time of the Determination of each Account reſpectively; and in caſe ſuch Monies ſhall have been iſſued for Services to be performed in any Part of Europe out of this Kingdom, then the Vouchers ſhall be delivered within Four Months of the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; if in the Weſt Indies, the Continent of America, or in Africa, within Six Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; and if in the Eaſt Indies, within Twelve Months after the Expiration of each Year's Accounts; unleſs it ſhall in each and every Caſe be made appear to the Satisfaction of the Commiſſioners of the Treafury, that the Failure of tranſmitting the ſame, within the Periods beforementioned, was unavoidable; in which Caſe ſuch further Delay may be granted by Warrant under the Hands of the Commiſſioners of the Treafury, or any Three of them, as they ſhall judge reaſonable; and in ſuch Caſes the Vouchers ſhall be delivered at the Expiration of the Term of Delay ſo granted, on Pain, upon Failure in any of the abovementioned Caſes, of paying ſuch Fine to His Maſteſty as the Court of Exchequer, on Application made to them, ſhall think fit to ſet and impoſe; which Fine the ſaid Court is hereby authorized and impowered to ſet and impoſe accordingly.

SECTION XXII. Provided always, and be it enacted, that when any Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants ſhall tranſmit to the Commiſſioners, to be appointed under the Authority of this Act, a ſufficient and ſatisfactory Diſcharge from the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, the Commiſſioners of His Maſteſty's Navy, the Commiſſioners for Viſtualling His Maſteſty's Navy, or the Commiſſioners of Sick and Hurt, for any Monies he or they ſhall have received in the ſaid Departments ſeverally, the ſaid Commiſſioners ſhall tranſmit a Duplicate of the ſame to His Maſteſty's Remembrancer in the Court of Exchequer, who ſhall forthwith ſtrike out the Name or Names of ſuch Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants from the Impreſt Roll; and ſuch Sub-Accountant or Sub-Accountants ſhall from thenceforth be diſcharged from any other or further Account for the ſame.
