Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Assembly of Jamaica, with the deepest Sense of Gratitude to Divine Providence, presume to lay before the Throne our unfeigned Congratulations on the Restoration of a Nation's Happiness in the joyful Event of your Majesty's Recovery from a long and dangerous Illness.

We regret that we have had no earlier Opportunity of offering to your Majesty this humble Tribute of our Duty; for although we are situated at a Distance from the animating Presence of our Sovereign, we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that as nothing could be more afflicting to us than the Indisposition of the best of Kings, so nothing has ever afforded us greater Joy than the Return of Health to a Monarch who considers all His Subjects, however remote, as equally

entitled to His paternal Regard and Protection. We praise God for this gracious Interposition of Divine Favour, and further beseech Him to continue to your Majesty the full Enjoyment of Health and every other Blessing, in the Prosperity and unanimous Loyalty of all your People,
