A S feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Subjects of Great Britain, bave from Time to Time gone into Foreign Countries to exercise their several Callings, contrary to the Laws of these Kingdoms; the follow-ing Abstrats of Acts of Parliament of their late Majesties, King George the First and Second, and of Majeffiet, King George the First and Secona, and of His prefent Majefly, for preventing fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all Persons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Disobedience to them.—And it will be observed, that fuch Penalties likewise extend to those who are any ways concerned or infrumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of these Kingdoms, or in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themselves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27.

F any Perfon fhall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries, out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Informa-tion, in any of the Courts at Westminster, or at the Affizes or Quarter-Seffions, he shall be fined any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprised Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-fon having been once convicted, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Difcretion of the Court, and imprifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid.

If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Artlficers, shall go into any Country out of His Ma-jesty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King'a Subjects in any fuch Foreign Country, exercifing any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Consul of Great Britain, in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorised by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from henceforth inhabit within this Realm ; fuch Perfons thall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor or Administrator, or of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom, by Defcent, De-vife or Purchafe; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods, &c. within this Kingdom, to His Majefty's Ule, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majesty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of Peace that any Perfon is endeavour-ing to feduce any fuch Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out Artificer nath contracted, or is preparing to go out of His Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpofes afore-faid; fuch Juftice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Juffice; and if it fhall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sef-fions: And if fuch Perfon fhall refuse to give Secu-rity, the Justice may commit him to Goal till the next Affizes or Quarter Sessions, and until he shall

The delivered by due Courfe of Law. And if any fuch Artificer thall be convicted upon Indictment of any fuch Promife, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the seas for the Purpofe aforefaid, he fhallgive tuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Ma effy's Dominions, as fuch Court fhall think reatonable, and fhall be imprifoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be protecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23 George M. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cot-ton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brass, or other Metal, or any Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any Foreign Coun-try, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indictment at the Affizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scotland, or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if fuch Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted shall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDKED POUNDS, and fhall fuffer Impri-fonment in the Common Goal of the County or Stewartry wherein such Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Foreiture be paid: And in Cale of a fubfequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending fhall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and shall fuffer Imprisonment in the Common Gaol of the County or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid.

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland fhall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly ufed in. or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finifhing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures or any Part of fuch Tools, he fhall for every Offence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Weftminfler, or in the Court of Seffion in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Gustoms in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and secure, in some of His Majesty's Warehouses, all such Tools or Utensils pro-

hibited to be exported, as fuch Officer Ihall find on Board any Veffel not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain; and all Tools fo feized Ihall, after Condemnation, be publickly fold to the beft Bidder; and one Moiety of the Produce Ihall be to the Ufe of His Majefty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who Ihall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibted to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he fhall for every fuch Offence forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penaltics inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majeffy, the Captain fhall not only forfeit ONE HUN-DRED POUNDS, but thall also forfeit his Emp oyment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majeffy.

If any Officer of the Cuftoms in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Experting of any of the faid Fools, or knowingly affer the fame to be done, he fhall forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majefty.

under His Majesty. One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Use of the Person who shall sue for the same.

Statutes 14, 21, 25 and 26 of His prefent Majefly.

BY thefe Statutes the like Penalties and Forfeitures as above mentioned are extended to Perfons packing or putting on board any Veffel, not bound directly for fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, any Machine, Engine, Tool, Prefs, Paper, Utenfil or Implement whatfoever ufed in, or proper for the working or finishing of the Cotton, Linen, Steel or Iron Manufactures of this Kingdom, or any Part or Parts of fuch Machines or Implements, or any Models or Plans thereof; and all Captains of Ships and other Perfons receiving or being in Poffedion of any fuch Articles, with an Intent to export the fame to Foreign Parts, and all Custom-houfe Officers fuffering an Entry to be made thereof, are respectively liable to the like Penalties as are above mentioned, in the Cafe of Tools and Utenfils ufed in the Woollen and Silk Manufactures.
