Dublin Caftle, March 17, 1790. HIS Day his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant went in State to the Houfe of Peers, with the ufual Solemnity, and the Com-mons being fent for, gave the Royal Affent to

An A& for granting unto His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, an additional Duty on Wines, Hides, Beer, Ale, and other Goods and Merchandizes therein mentioned, and for probibiting the Importation of all Gold and Silver Lace, except of the Manufacture of Great Britain, and of all Cambricks, Lawns and Glass, except the Manufacture of Great Britain and France and the French Dominions in Europe, and of all Hops, except of the Growth of Great Britain and the British Plantations.

An Act for granting to His Majefty the feveral Aids, Duties, Rates, Impositions and Taxes therein particularly expressed to be applied to the Payment of the Interest of the principal Sums therein provided for; and towards the Discharge of fuch principal Sums in fuch Manner as therein is directed, and for fuch other Purpofes as are therein mentioned.

An Act for granting unto His Majefly, His Heirs and Succeffors, certain Duties upon Malt.

An AEt for regulating the Sugar Trade, and for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, the Duties therein mentioned.

An AA for the Advancement of Trade, and for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successfors, the Jeweral Duties therein mentioned.

An AEI for granting to His Majefly, His Heirs and Succeffors, certain Duties and Rates upon the Portage and Conveyance of all Letters and Packets within this Kingdom.

An AE to promote the Linen and Hempen Manufacture, by encreasing the Supply of Irish Flax-Seed, and encouraging the Export of Linent and Sail-Cloth, and for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs and Suc-ceffors, the Duties therein mentioned.

An Act for regulating the Coffee Trade, and for

granting to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors; the feveral Duties therein mentioned upon Coffee.

An Act for granting certain Aids, Duties and Im-bofitions to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, for the Time therein mentioned, and for continuing the Effect of a Treaty of Commerce and Navigation con-cluded between His Majesty and the Most Christian King.

An AA for regulating and extending the Tobacco Trade, and for granting to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successfors, the Duties therein mentioned. An AA for licensing Hawkers and Pedlars, Petty

Chapmen, and other Perfons.

An Act for granting unto His Majesty, His Heirs and Successfors, certain Duties upon Carriages.

An Act for granting certain Duties upon Licences to be taken out by the feveral Perfons therein mentioned:

An Act for granting to His Majefty, His Heirs and Succeffors, several Duties therein mentioned, to be levied by the Commissioners for managing the Stamp Duties.

An Act to continue the Effect of an Act, entitled, An Act for the further Amendment of the Law relative to the registering of Freeholders.

An Act for further continuing an Act, entitled, An

Act for facilitating the Trade and Intercourfe between this Kingdom and the United States of America. An Act for punifying Mutiny and Defertion, and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters within this Kingdom.

An Act to explain and amend an Act, paffed in the Fourteenth and Fifteenth Years of King Charles the rourieenin and rificentin lears of King Charles the Second, entitled, An Act for taking away the Court of Wards and Liveries, and Tenures in Capite, and by Knights Service; and also an Act passed in the Traven-ty-first and Twenty-fecond Years of His present Man jesty's Reign, entitled, An Act to allow Persons pro-fessing the Popish Religion to teach School in this King-dom and for regulating the Education of Passa. dom, and for regulating the Education of Papifis; and also to repeal Part of certain Laws relative to the Guardianship of their Children.
