A P R O C L A M A T I O N.

WESTMORLAND.

WHEREAS the Parliament of this Kingdom, which stood prorogued to the 5th Day of June, 1790, hath this Day been dissolved: And whereas His Majesty, by and with the Advice of His Lieutenant-General and Privy Council of this Kingdom, for certain arduous and urgent Affairs touching His Majesty and the State and Defence of His Kingdom of Ireland, and of the Church of Ireland, hath ordained that a Parliament be holden at the City of Dublin on the 20th Day of May next ensuing, by his said Lieutenant-General, or in his Absence by His Justices General and General Governors of His said Kingdom, His Deputies in that Behalf; then and there to treat and have Conference with the Prelates, Peers and great Men of this Realm, concerning the same.

And whereas in pursuance of an Act passed in this Kingdom, entitled, "An Act to regulate the Manner of passing Bills, and to prevent Delays in summoning of Parliaments," His Majesty has been pleased to grant His Royal Licence, under the Great Seal of Great Britain, for calling and holding the said Parliament.

These are therefore to publish and make known, by this our Proclamation, His Majesty's Royal Pleasure in that Behalf, and that the said Parliament is accordingly to be holden at Dublin on Thursday the 20th Day of May next; and that Writs will be issued for summoning the said Parliament, bearing Test Tomorrow, being the 9th Day of April: Whereof all Persons concerned are to take Notice.

Letters Patent have been passed under the Great Seal of this Kingdom, containing a Grant of the Dignity of a Baronet unto Charles Henry Talbot, of Belfast in the County of Antrim, Esq; and to his Heirs Male.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that on Friday the 9th Instant, between the Hours of One and Two o'Clock in the Morning, Sir Harry Parker, Baronet, and Robert Banks Hodgkinson, Esq; were robbed in a Hackney Coach, No. 934,

in Albemarle-street, by a Footpad unknown, who wounded Mr. Hodgkinson in the Face with a Hanger.

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the Robbery above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person who wounded the said Mr. Hodgkinson as aforesaid) who shall discover his Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
