The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS by an Act made in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intituled, "An Act for preventing certain "Inftruments from being required from Ships "belonging to the United States of America; " and to give to His Majefty, for a limited " Time, certain Powers for the better carrying " on Trade and Commerce between the Subjects " of His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants of the faid United States;" which faid Act has been continued by feveral fubsequent Acts until the Fifth Day of April, 1790. And whereas by an Act made in the Twenty-fourth Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act to extend the " Powers of an Act, made in the Twenty-third Year of His prefent Majefly, for giving His Ma-" jefty certain Powers for the better carrying on "Trade and Commerce between the Subjects of * His Majesty's Dominions and the Inhabitants " of the United States of America, to the Trade and Commerce of this Kingdom with the British " Colonies and Plantations in America, with Re-" fpect to certain Articles therein mentioned," the Powers given by the faid recited Act were extended to the Trade and Intercourse between this Kingdom and the British Colonies and Plantations in America, fo far as the fame might relate to Iron, Hemp and Sailcloth, and other Articles of the Produce of any Place bordering on the Baltic, which might be exported from this Kingdom; which last mentioned Act has also by feveral fub fequent Acts been continued until the faid 5th Day of April, 1790.

And whereas by another Act passed in this prefent Seffion of Parliament, intituled, "An Act to continue " the Lawsnow in Force for regulating the Trade be-" tween the Subjects of His Majefty's Dominions, " and the Inhabitants of the Territories belonging

" States ;" it is declared to be expedient that the faid Act of the Twenty-third Year of His present Majefty's Reign, fo far only as the fame extends to the Trade and Commerce carried on between this Kingdom, and the People and Territories belong-ing to the United States of America; and alfo th t the faid Act of the Twenty-fourth Year of His Majefty's Reign fhould be further continued and be in Force ; and it is thereby enacted, That the faid Acts shall continue and be in Force until the 5th Day of April, 1791; His Majesty doth thereupon, by and. with the Advice of His Privy Council, hereby order and declare, That any Unmanufactured Goods and Merchandizes, the Importation of which into this Kingdom is not prohibited by Law, (except Fifh, Oil, Blubber, Whale-Fins and Spermaceti;) and any Pig Iron, Bar Iron, Pitch, Tar, Turpentine, Rolin, Pot-Ath, Pearl-Ath, Indico, Mafts, Yards and Bowfprits, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, and no other Goods or Merchandize, may (until fur-ther Order) be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, either in Britifh built Ships, owned by His Majefty's Sub-jects, and navigated according to Law, or in Ships built in the Countries belonging to the United States of America, or any of them, and owned by the Subjects of the faid United States, or any of them, and whereof the Master and Three-fourths of the Mariners at least are Subjects of the faid United States, or any of them; and may be entered and landed in any Port of this Kingdom, upon Payment of the fame Duties as the like Sorts of Goods or Merchandize are or may be fubject and liable to if imported in British-built Shivs, owned by His Majesty's Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any British Island or Plantation in America, notwithstanding fuch Goods or Merchandize, or the Ships in which the fame may be brought, may not be accompanied with the t Certificates or other Documents heretofore required by Law. And it is hereby further ordered, that there shall be the fame Drawbacks and Bounties on Merchandizes to the United States of America, fo far as the
" fame relate to the Trade and Commerce carried
on between this Kingdom and the Inhabitants
of the Countries belonging to the faid United Good

Goods or Merchandize to any of the Illands, Plantations, or Colonies, belonging to the Crown of Great Britain in America; and that (until further Order) there shall be allowed and paid the same Drawbacks on the Exportation of any Sort of Foreign Hemp or Foreign Iron exported from. Great Britain into any British Colony or Plantation in America, or into the Territories of the United States of America, or any of them, as are or may hereafter be allowed by Law upon the Exportation of the like Sort of Hemp or Iron, and under the fame Rules, Regulations, Reflrictions, Penalties and Forfeitures in all Respects, as such Drawbacks are allowed and paid, or are fubject and liable to by Law, upon the Exportation of fuch Hemp and Iron into other Foreign Parts.

And His Majefty is hereby further pleafed to or. der, That any Tobacco, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the faid United States of America, may (until further Order) be imported, in Manner before-mentioned, upon Payment of the fame Duties as Tobacco imported by British Subjects from any British Colony or Plantation is or may hereafter be subject to; but under and subject nevertheless to all and singular the Regulations of an Act made and paffed in the Twentyninth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, in-tituled, "An Act for repealing the Duties on Tobacco and Snuff, and for granting new Duties in Lieu thereof."

And His Majefty is further pleafed to order, That any Rice, being the Growth or Production of any of the Territories of the United States of America, which shall be imported directly from thence into any of the Ports of this Kingdom, in Manner above-mentioned, may, upon the Importer paying down, in ready Money, the Duty of Eight pence the Hundred Weight, being Part of the Duties now p yable on the Importation of Rice, be landed and warehoused (except as hereinafter excepted) under His Majefly's Locks, in fuch Warehoufes as shall be approved of for that Purpole by the Commissioners of His Majefty's Cuftoms, or any Four or more of them, upon the Importer's own Bond for Payment of the Remainder of the Duties due and payable for such Rice, within Eighteen Months, according to the net Weight and Quantity of such Rice at the Time it shall be fo landed : But it is His Majesty's Pleasure neverthelefs, that upon the Importation of any fuch Rice into the Ports of London, Briltol, Portfmouth, Cowes, Liverpool, Lancaster, Falmouth, Poole, Whitehaven, Hull, Greenock, and Port Glafgow, or either of them, in the Manner herein before expressed, the Importer shall be at Liberty, (until further Order) to enter and land the fame without Payment of any Duty whatever; in which Cafe fuch Rice shall be warehoused under the joint Locks of His Majefty and the Proprietors, in fuch Warehoufe or Ware houses as shall be approved for that Purpose, by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any Four or more of them; every Expence attending which warehousing shall be borne by the faid Proprietors, and that fuch Proprietor or Proprietors, or his or their known Agent, thall from Time to Time, at all feafonable Hours, as Occafion may require, have free Accefs to fuch Warehouses, in the Prefence of fome proper Officer of the Cultoms, for the Purpole of ikreening and thifting the Rice, to prevent its receiving Damage. And that if any Rice which shall be fo imported from the Territories of the faid United States into any of the Ports abovementioned respectively, and warehoused as aforefaid, shall be taken out of the Warehoufes wherein the fame fhall

be fecured, under the joint Locks or rus a geny and the Proprietors as aforefaid, for Home Consumption; the full Duties due and payable upon the Importation of fuch Rice into this Kingdom for Home Confumption, shall, previously to its being taken out of fuch Warehouses, be paid to the Collector of His Majefty's Cuftoms at the Ports where fuch Rice shall be fo warehoused ; but that such Proprietor, if he intends to export fuch Rice, shall have Liberty to export the fame from fuch Warehoufes respectively, under the usual Regulations, without Payment of any Duty whatever; and that if any Rice which final have been imported into any Port of this Kingdom, not herein before specially named, and shall have been warehoused upon the Importer's Bond in Manner aforefaid, shall, within the Time herein before mentioned, be taken out of the Warehouse wherein it shall have been to secured, to be exported directly from thence, the Bond entered into for the Payment of the faid Duties thereon shall be discharged in like Manner as Bonds entered into for the Duties upon Tobacco, are directed to be discharged by any Act of Parliament in Force.
